School Readiness

- the concept that children have developed a group of skills necessary to learn
- having the ability to learn and cope with the school environment without undue stress
- when a child can start to benefit from exposure to a specific instructional method

Factors that can affect Kindergarten Readiness:

- Child's rate of development
- Chronological age
- Preschool experiences
- Early health
- Family circumstances
- Personal characteristics



Characteristics of Children Ready For Kindergarten



Emotional Readiness

- Separates easily from parent
- Able to handle mildly stressful incidents
- Generally compliant and dependable
- Growing in unselfishness, yet still self-centered
- Trustful of new people



Social Readiness

- Accepts helpful suggestions, adjusts behavior
- Plays cooperatively with others
- Dresses self without assistance
- Comforts others who are distressed
- Shares, takes turns, is able to wait
- Concerned with right and wrong




Motor Readiness

- Uses crayons comfortably
- Cuts with increasing accuracy
- Can do simple puzzles
- Holds writing tools firmly
- Becoming proficient in self-help skills
- Ready to sit and attend to task for 10 to 15 minutes



Cognitive Readiness

- Enjoys listening to stories
- Speech is intelligible
- Is able to respond "on topic"
- Developing left to right scanning techniques
- Recalls details after listening to a story
- Starting to recognize and name alphabet letters
- Can remember simple songs, chants, and rhymes



Kindergarten screening is...

- Kindergarten Screening is a *brief* assessment, usually lasting twenty minutes or less.
- The purpose of Kindergarten screening is to help us identify children who *may* have significant learning differences.
- We conduct K Screening in response to a state law that requires all public schools to offer an assessment procedure for children before they enter kindergarten.

*Kindergarten Screening will be held at Beal, Coolidge, Paton and Spring Street Schools on **June 20th and 21st**.*

Screening appointments will be communicated through the Registrar's office

Preparing for Kindergarten

- Know first and last name
- Separate from family, trust other adults
- Be independent in the bathroom
- Know how to verbalize needs
- Operate a backpack independently




