4. Please Note – Shrewsbury Robotics Summer Program

Shrewsbury Robotics is offering a summer program for students entering grades 4-8 in fall 2023. Science and engineering play a big part in our everyday lives and in the world. We teach students about science and engineering by using lego robotics, solar powered robots, rockets, and middle school-level engineering challenges. All activities teach students about teamwork, compromise, success, failure, and much more! They also get to have fun in the process and learn valuable team working skills. The students are grouped into teams and each team is

coached by one or more high school students who are members of the robotics team and in most cases have been Lego League competitors themselves. The program is overseen by adult mentors.

The solar robots and rockets are tested at the end of the week. On Friday, we provide the students with a pizza lunch (this is included in the price). During Friday afternoon, the students compete against the other teams using the Lego Robots they have been building during the week. This competition is based on the FIRST Lego League competition from the preceding season. Parents are invited to come and watch this.

Voter Registration Deadline: Friday, April 21st at 5:00 p.m. for the May 2nd Election

How to Register to Vote

- Registering Online: In order to register to vote online, you must have a signature on file with the Registry of Motor Vehicles. If you currently have a Massachusetts driver's license or state ID card, you may use the [online voter registration application](#) to register, update your address, or change your party affiliation. Voter registration forms submitted online must be submitted by midnight on the date of the voter registration deadline.
- Registering by Mail: If you do not qualify to register to vote online, or if you would prefer to register by mail, you may download the [voter registration form](#). The form must be completed, signed, and delivered to the Town Clerk's Office. Voter registration forms submitted by mail must be postmarked no later than April 21, 2023 for the May 2, 2023 election.
- Registering in Person: Register in person at the Town Clerk's Office.

Options for Voting

- Vote at the polls on Tuesday, May 2nd. Polls are open 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- Vote by Mail: A [Vote by Mail Application](#) must be filed with the Town Clerk's office in order to receive a ballot by mail. The deadline to apply is 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 25th. All completed ballots must be received by the close of polls on Tuesday, May 2nd at the Town Clerk's Office.
- Vote by Absentee Ballot: [Absentee ballots application](#) by mail must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 25th. The deadline for absentee voting at the counter is 12:00 p.m. on Monday, May 1st. You can find more information on who qualifies for an absentee ballot [here](#).
