1. Please Note – Employment Opportunity: Retail Manager for Maple & Main

Shrewsbury Public Schools Employment Opportunity: Retail Manager for Maple & Main,
Presented by the RISE Program

The [RISE program](#), inclusive of Shrewsbury's new retail business, Maple & Main, supports students between the ages of 18-22 with special abilities to successfully transition into adulthood.

Shrewsbury Public Schools is seeking applicants for a Retail Manager, who will be responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of a retail store and learning hub, Maple & Main, located at 557 Main Street. Maple & Main will be staffed by students, ages 18-22, in the Shrewsbury Public Schools RISE program. Our students are supported by special education teachers, assistants, and job coaches. This year-round position includes (tentative) work hours including 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. One of the work days may include 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. to accommodate customers that are unable to get to the store before 4:00 p.m. The store will be closed on Sundays and Mondays.

RISE focuses on increasing students' independence while providing them with a myriad of opportunities to engage in the local community, all while learning skills and strategies to participate in community learning experiences, wellness activities, and both volunteer and paid work opportunities. Students practice the skills they have learned in the classroom and apply those skills in the natural community setting, which entails the opening of Maple & Main, a new retail business in the center of Shrewsbury!

This position will report to the public school department and work closely with the school administration to ensure the success of the store and the students. The store contains retail, classroom, and office spaces, in addition to an area for students to socialize. This is a unique opportunity for somebody with both business skills and educational experience. Salary ranges from \$45,000 to \$55,000 annually, and this position is benefits-eligible, including paid vacation, personal and sick time, and health insurance. 4. Please Note – Homeless/Migrant Family Assistance in Shrewsbury

On Friday, May 19, 2023 at approximately 4:30 PM, the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD), contacted the Town of Shrewsbury to inform Officials of the temporary placement of 12 families at a lodging facility in Shrewsbury until May 29, 2023. Additional information has been provided as of Tuesday, May 30, 2023 from DHCD advising that there are 40 families placed at the Shrewsbury lodging facility until further notice.

Effective Tuesday, May 30, 2023, a donation collection bin has been placed outside of the Shrewsbury Town Hall, 100 Maple Avenue, Shrewsbury, MA. Donations may be dropped off during business hours and the bins will be monitored continuously by Town Staff. Below is a list of in-kind donations that are needed to support the families:

- Diapers (all sizes) and wipes
- Personal Care Items (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste, lotion, chapstick, feminine hygiene products, shaving cream, baby shampoo, baby lotion, etc.)
- Ziploc Bags
- Laundry Detergent (pods only)
- New Children's Clothing (undergarments, socks, shoes for ages infant - 17)
- Over the counter medication for adults, children and infants (Tylenol, Motrin, Advil and Pedialyte, etc.)

For those who would like to provide assistance or additional support to the families, the Town of Shrewsbury will be accepting monetary donations to support the individuals and families at the
