1. Please Note – Two SHS Lunch and Learn Guest Speakers, March 15th (New)

<u>Do you have a student interested in learning more about Artificial Intelligence (AI), Product Management, or the Tech Industry and startups?</u>

This week, on March 15th, the SHS Lunch and Learn guest speaker is returning for a repeat engagement, since many students did not have the opportunity to meet him. Mr. Abhinav Garg, Product Manager for an Al developer platform startup, whose product is used by OpenAl who built ChatGPT. Mr. Garg has Bachelors of Engineering (Electrical) and Masters of Science (Software) from India, and has 21+ years of experience in the tech industry. He started his career as a Sales Executive at a small ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) software firm in India, and later pivoted to become a software engineer at a tech consulting firm called Sapient. After moving to the US just over 6 years ago, he made another career shift within the tech industry by joining a Data & Al startup called Databricks which was at the forefront of Enterprise Al at that point. He is currently working at an Al developer platform startup called Weights & Biases, where he leads the product management. Their product is used by OpenAl who built ChatGPT. He would love to talk to SHS students about product management as a career, its relevance in the tech industry & startups, how different businesses think about Al, and related career opportunities available. Students who do not attend Shrewsbury Public Schools are not eligible for this discount, regardless of income status.
