The Summer Fun Program is a great way to prepare your child for the start of kindergarten. Students will become familiar with their school building and experience the routines of a typical

day in a kindergarten class. They will leave feeling more confident and ready for the first day of school!

All preschool students who will be starting kindergarten at Shrewsbury Public Schools in the fall of 2023 are eligible to register. The program will run in each of the five elementary schools, so please register for the location where your child will be attending kindergarten.

1. Please Note – Shrewsbury Public Library: Message from Library Trustees (New)

We've had many discussions with our library staff and community partners to try to create a safe environment for middle school aged kids. We restricted the students to the young adult and community commons sections of the library, offered age-appropriate activities, and volunteered to help monitor and supervise the students during the time they were in the library. These efforts did help somewhat; but, put simply, we cannot safely supervise and manage the number of students at the library. Behavioral issues also continue to impact overall safety and disturb other patrons' use of the library. There is also concern for students' safety while walking to the library and through the center of town and in the parking lot, as many children have been observed to disregard traffic.

At a properly posted public meeting, the Board of Library Trustees voted unanimously on June 20, 2023 to change the Child Safety Policy regarding when children can use the library building without adult supervision in response to the above. The updated policy, effective July 1, 2023 reads:

Children through grade six must be continually attended and supervised by a parent or parent's representative while in the library. Children in grades seven and eight may be left unattended for a maximum of two hours.

7 Scientific Reasons to Meditate Now

Join the Shrewsbury Public Library on Tuesday, August 1st at 7:00 p.m. with Manish Saggur, PhD and Assistant Professor in Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University, for a virtual presentation of neuroscientific data on how regular meditation practices improve physical, mental, and emotional health. He will also discuss how happiness and harmony can be gained by focusing one's attention during meditation.

Dr. Saggur directs the Brain Dynamics Lab at Stanford University, which is dedicated to developing computational methods for neuroimaging data to better understand individual differences in brain functioning. He received his doctorate from the University of Texas at Austin and completed his postdoctoral training at Stanford. As part of his doctoral work, he developed computational methods to understand how brain activity changes with intensive meditation training. Summer Playground Program

As parents, we are always looking for our kids to be interactive and involved during the summer. Kids can't ask for more than being around friends, playing indoor/outdoor games like capture the flag or dodgeball, cool art projects, exciting daily camp themes like "Minion Day," "Bubble Mania," or "Ninja Warrior Day," and of course afternoon swimming at Sunset Beach! Every afternoon, we bus full-day participants to Sunset Beach, which is located on Old Faith Road in Shrewsbury. We arrive at Sunset Beach at 1:00 p.m. and return back to Coolidge School at 4:00 p.m. Full-day participants need to bring lunch, a towel, a bathing suit, and sunscreen. Pack plenty of snacks and water for the kids! Child-to-staff ratio is not more than 10 to 1. Staff directors are CPR/First Aid and Epi-Pen trained.

5. Please Note – Homeless/Migrant Family Assistance in Shrewsbury

On Friday, May 19, 2023 at approximately 4:30 PM, the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD), contacted the Town of Shrewsbury to inform Officials of the temporary placement of 12 families at a lodging facility in Shrewsbury until May 29, 2023. Additional information has been provided as of Tuesday, May 30, 2023 from DHCD advising that there are 40 families placed at the Shrewsbury lodging facility until further notice.

Effective Tuesday, May 30, 2023, a donation collection bin has been placed outside of the Shrewsbury Town Hall, 100 Maple Avenue, Shrewsbury, MA. Donations may be dropped off during business hours and the bins will be monitored continuously by Town Staff. Below is a list of in-kind donations that are needed to support the families:

- Diapers (all sizes) and wipes
- Personal Care Items (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste, lotion, chapstick, feminine hygiene products, shaving cream, baby shampoo, baby lotion, etc.)
- Ziploc Bags
- Laundry Detergent (pods only)
- New Children's Clothing (undergarments, socks, shoes for ages infant - 17)
- Over the counter medication for adults, children and infants (Tylenol, Motrin, Advil and Pedialyte, etc.)

For those who would like to provide assistance or additional support to the families, the Town of Shrewsbury will be accepting monetary donations to support the individuals and families at the shelter.
