### **3. Please Note – New Street Address for Shrewsbury High School**

At the May 2023 Annual Town Meeting, a change of address was approved for Shrewsbury High School, changing it from 64 Holden Street to 75 Cypress Avenue.

There are multiple reasons for making this change, including future possibility of road repairs receiving state funding and ability for the Shrewsbury Police Department to enforce moving violations on public roadways. Previously, the stretch of roadway from Holden Street to the building was considered a "driveway" and now it is a public road.

### **4. Please Note – Shrewsbury Public Schools Offers Meals at No Cost for Students**

Shrewsbury Public Schools will be participating in the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program. As part of this program, Shrewsbury Public Schools will offer healthy meals every school day. The Massachusetts legislature has provided funding to make meals available at no cost to all students during the school year 2023-2024, regardless of household income. However, families should still complete a Meal Benefit Application as this provides data for key funding for academic resources and may also connect families to additional benefits.
