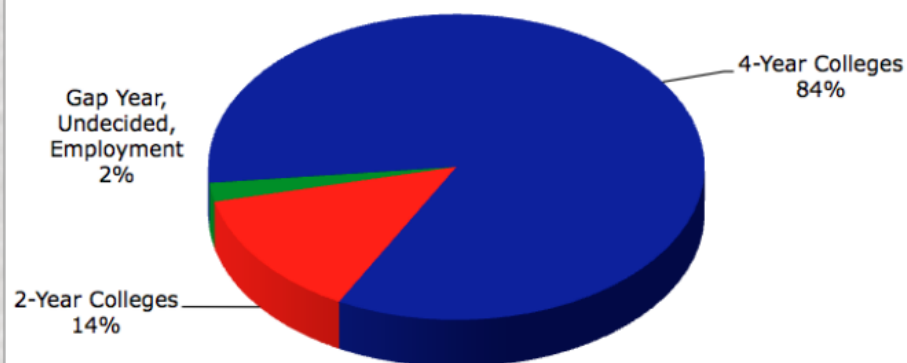
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Class of 2016 Future Plans

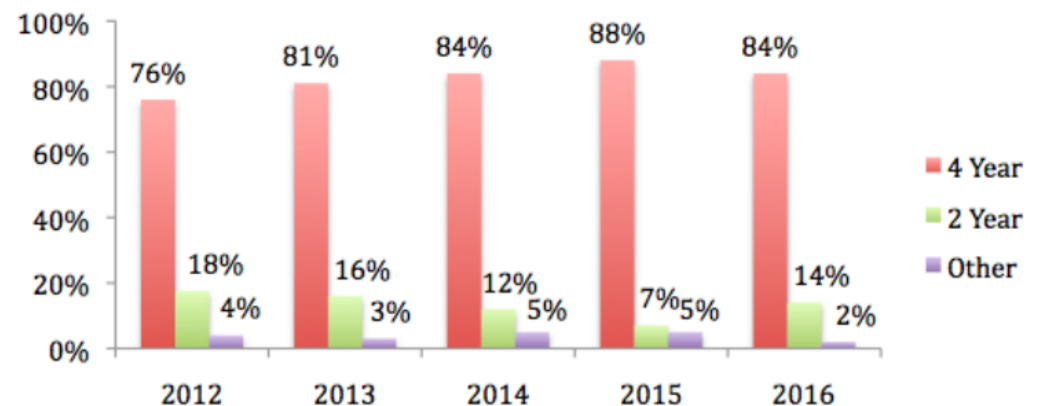
392 students graduated in the Class of 2016 with the following plans:

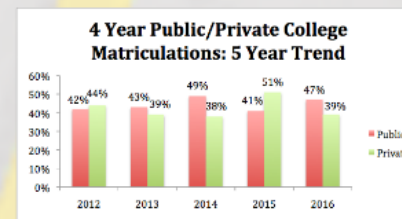
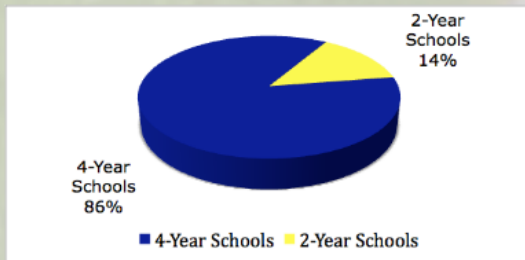
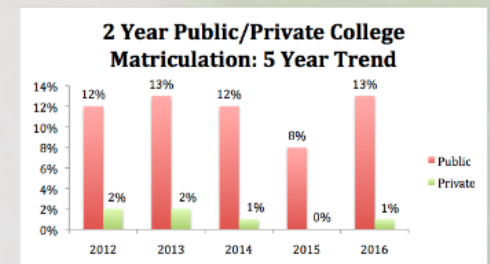
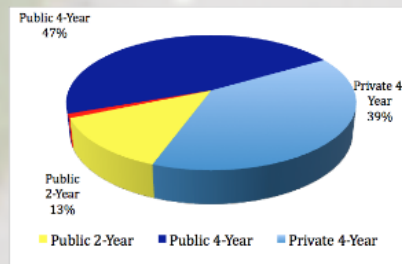


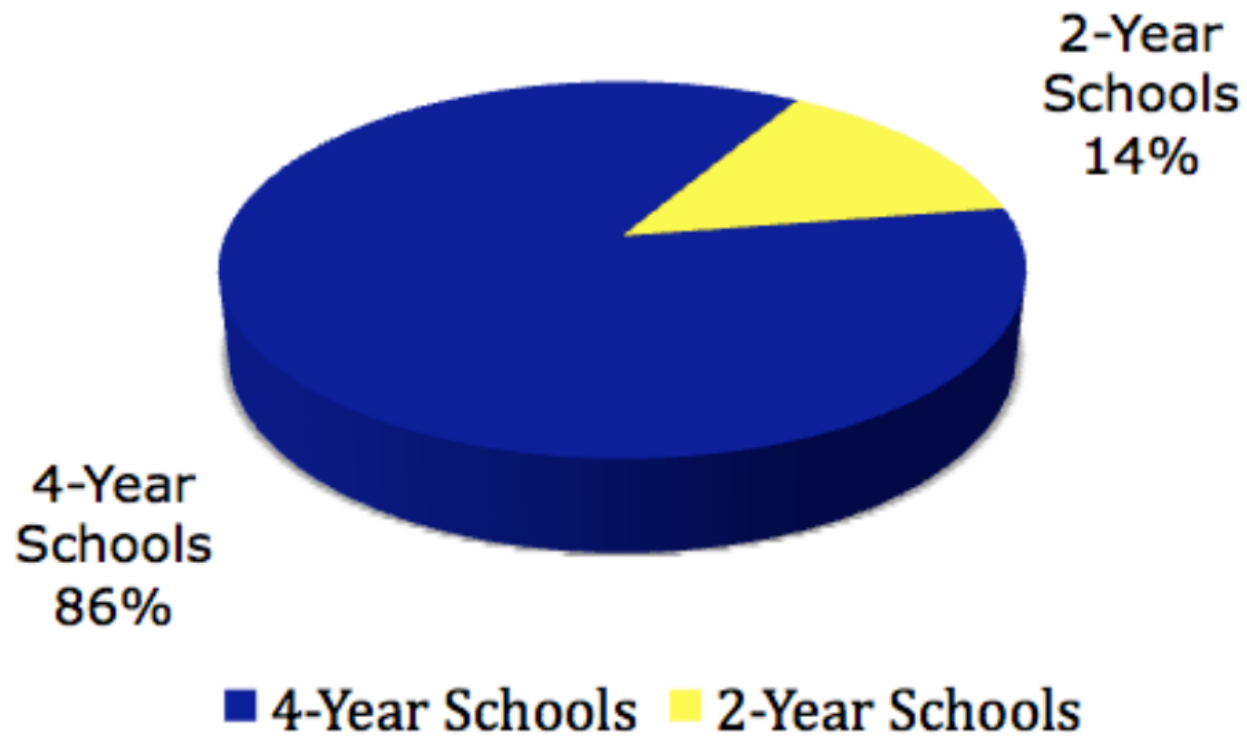
Future Plans: 5 Year Trend



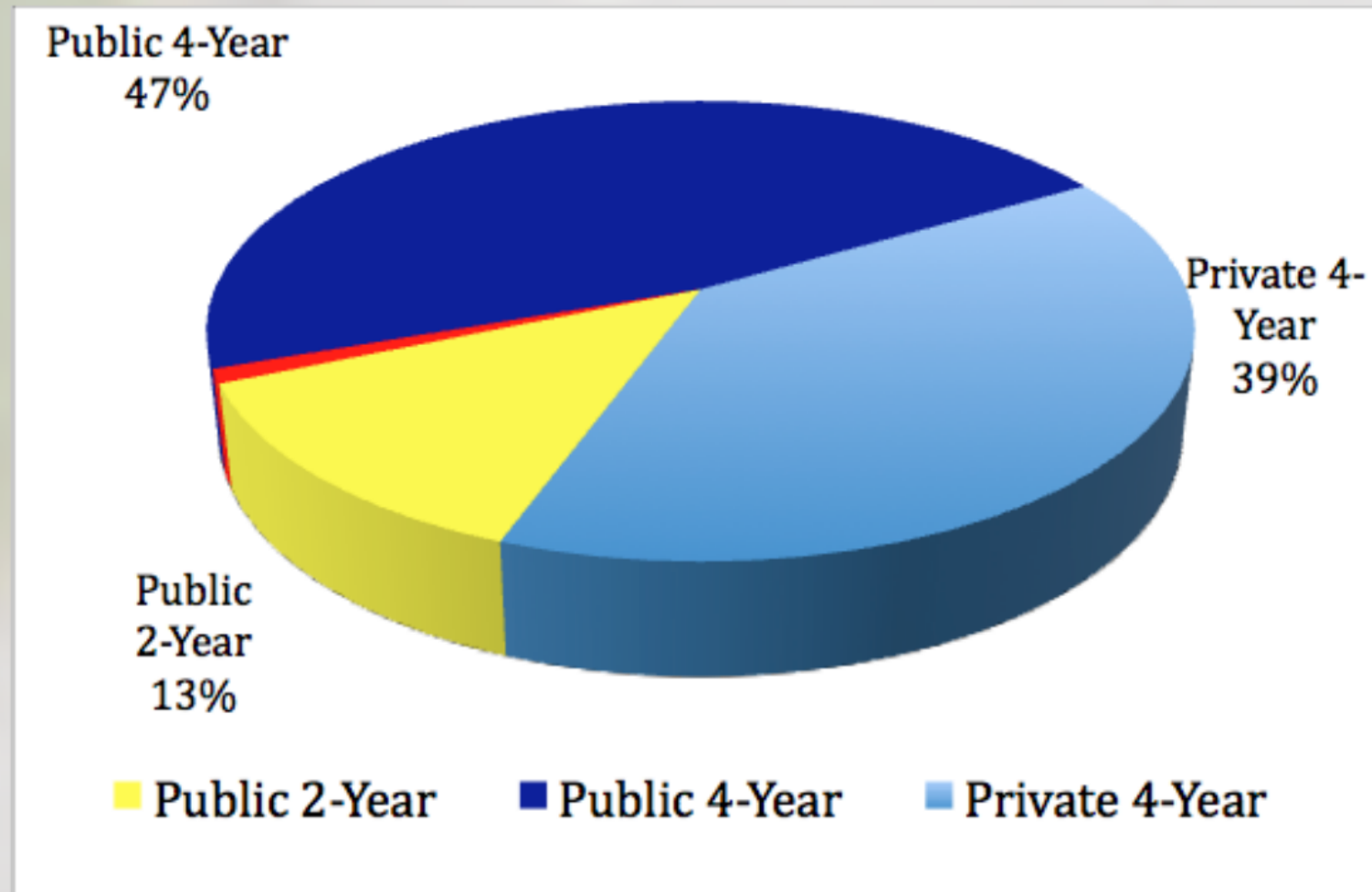
Public and Private 2- and 4-Year Matriculations

- 60% attended public colleges and universities; 40% attended private colleges and universities



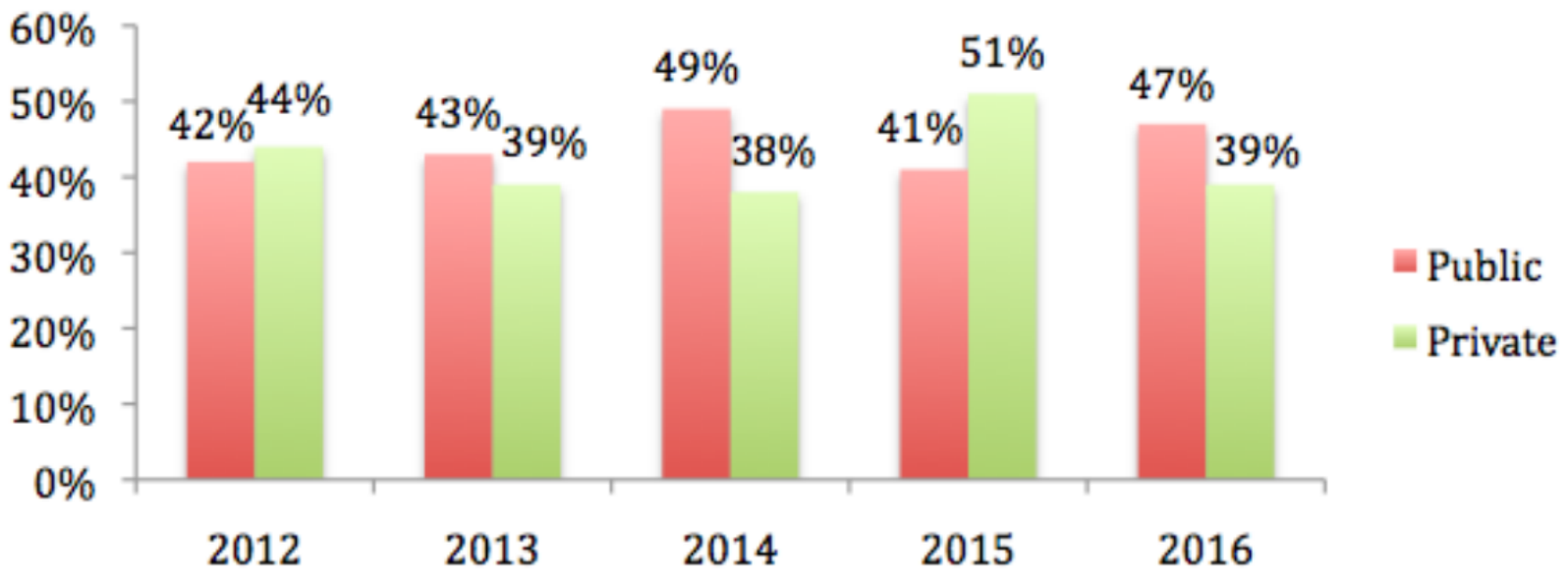

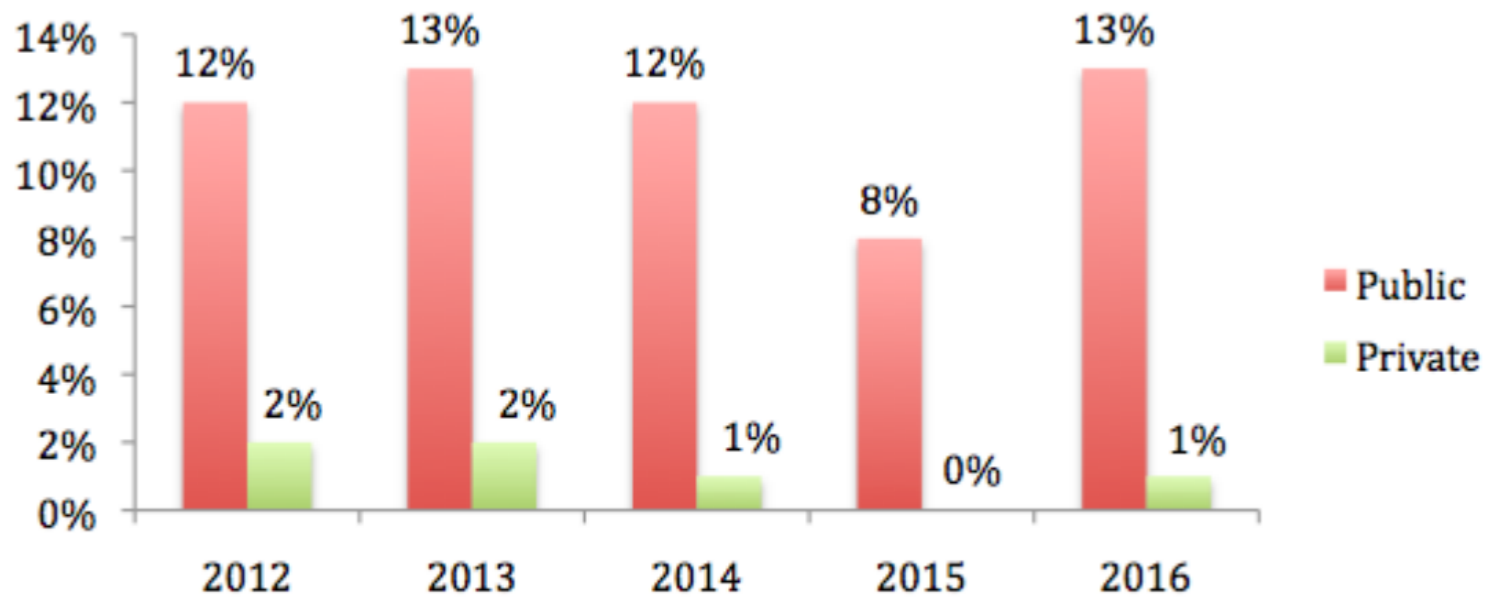

4 Year Public/Private College Matriculations: 5 Year Trend



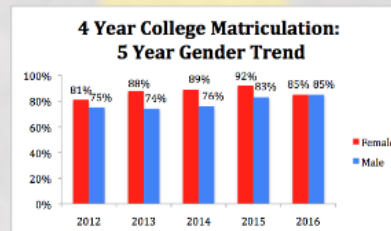
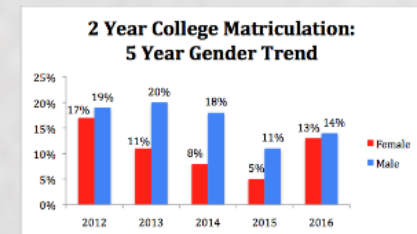
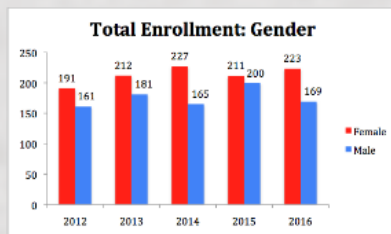
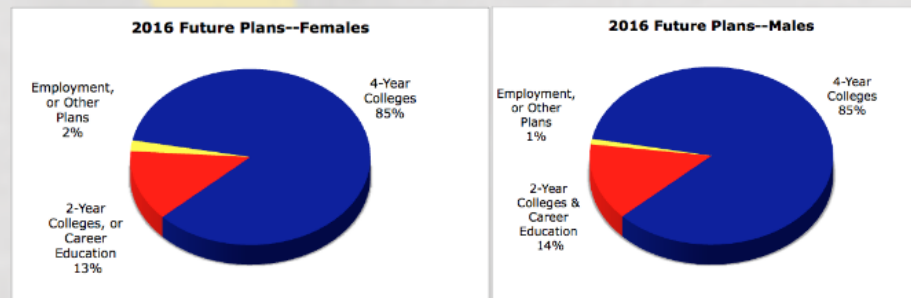
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2 Year Public/Private College Matriculation: 5 Year Trend



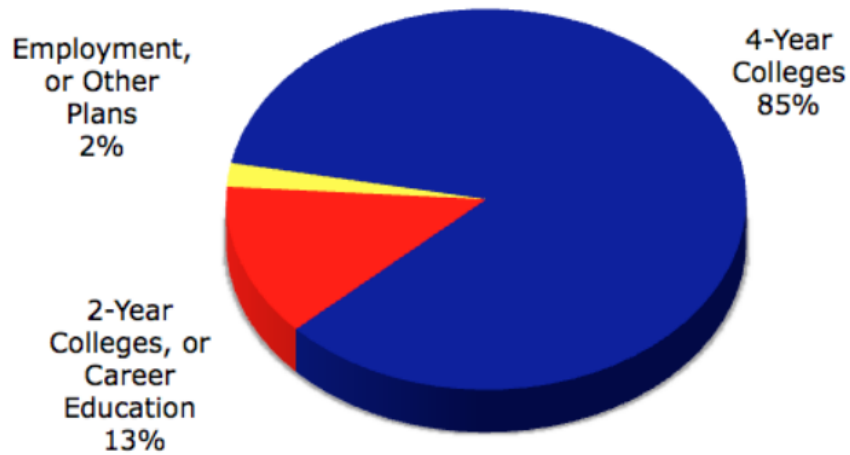
Future Plans by Gender

The Class of 2016 consists of 223 females and 169 males.

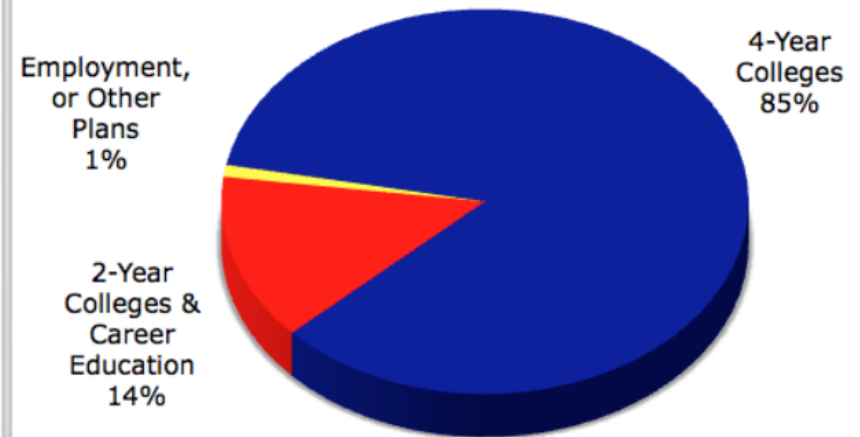


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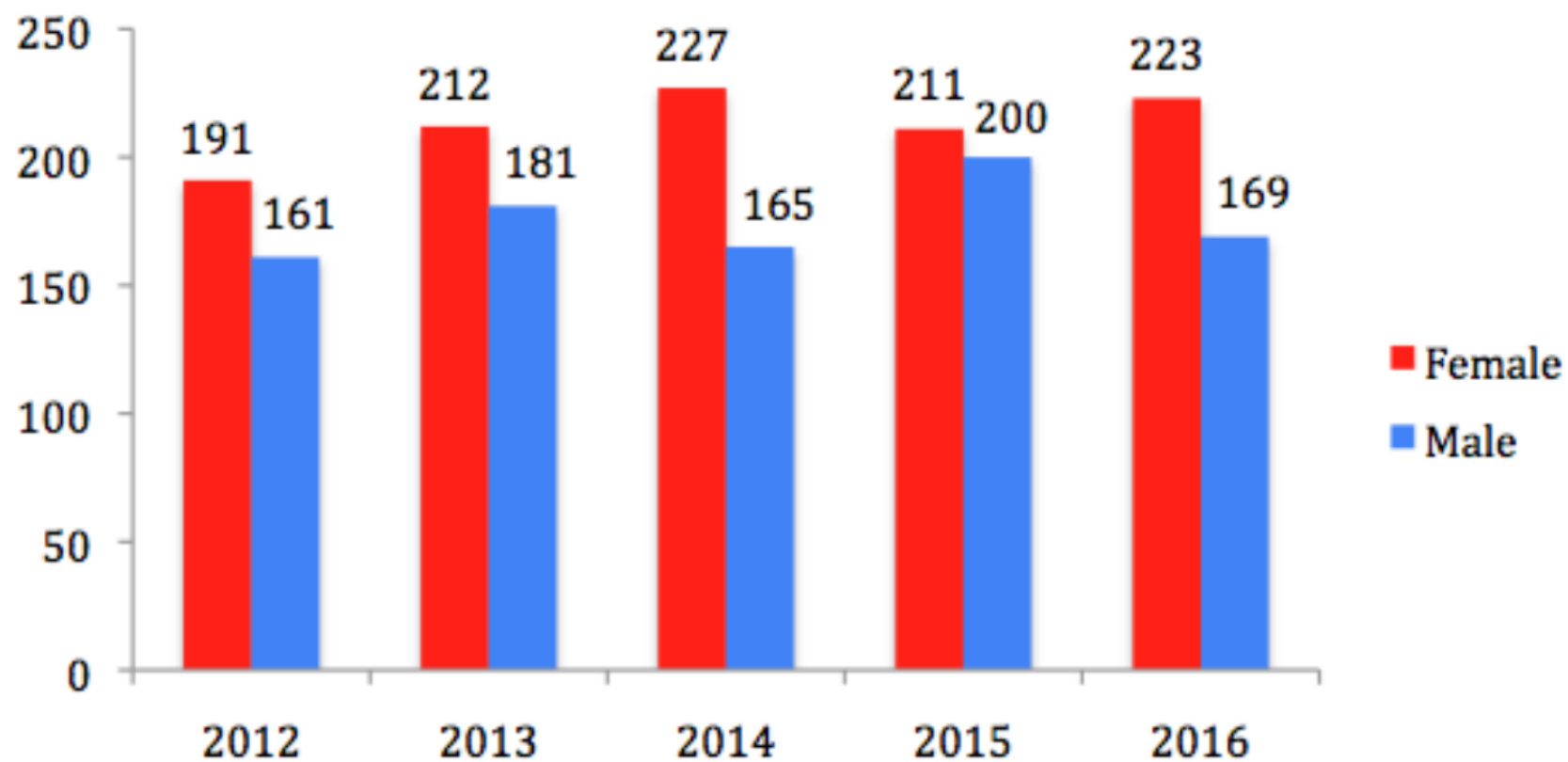
2016 Future Plans--Females



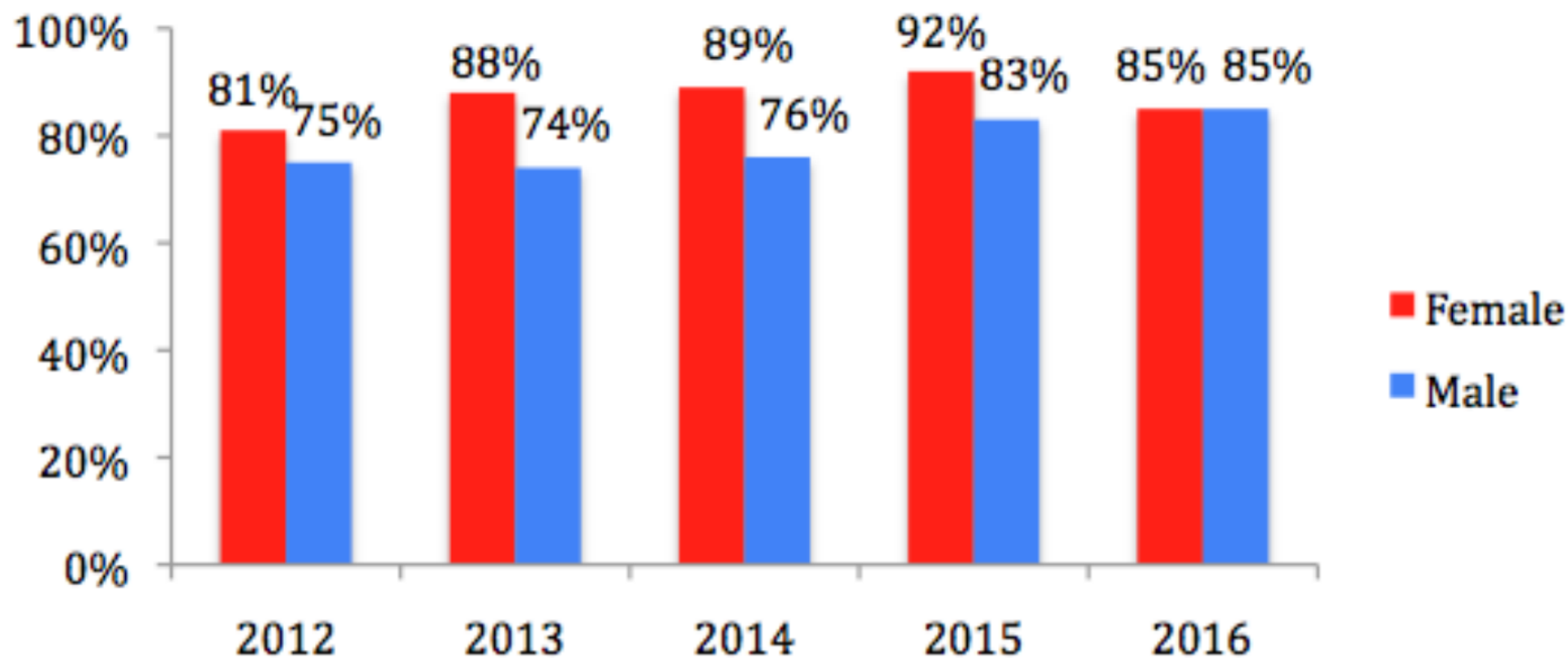
2016 Future Plans--Males



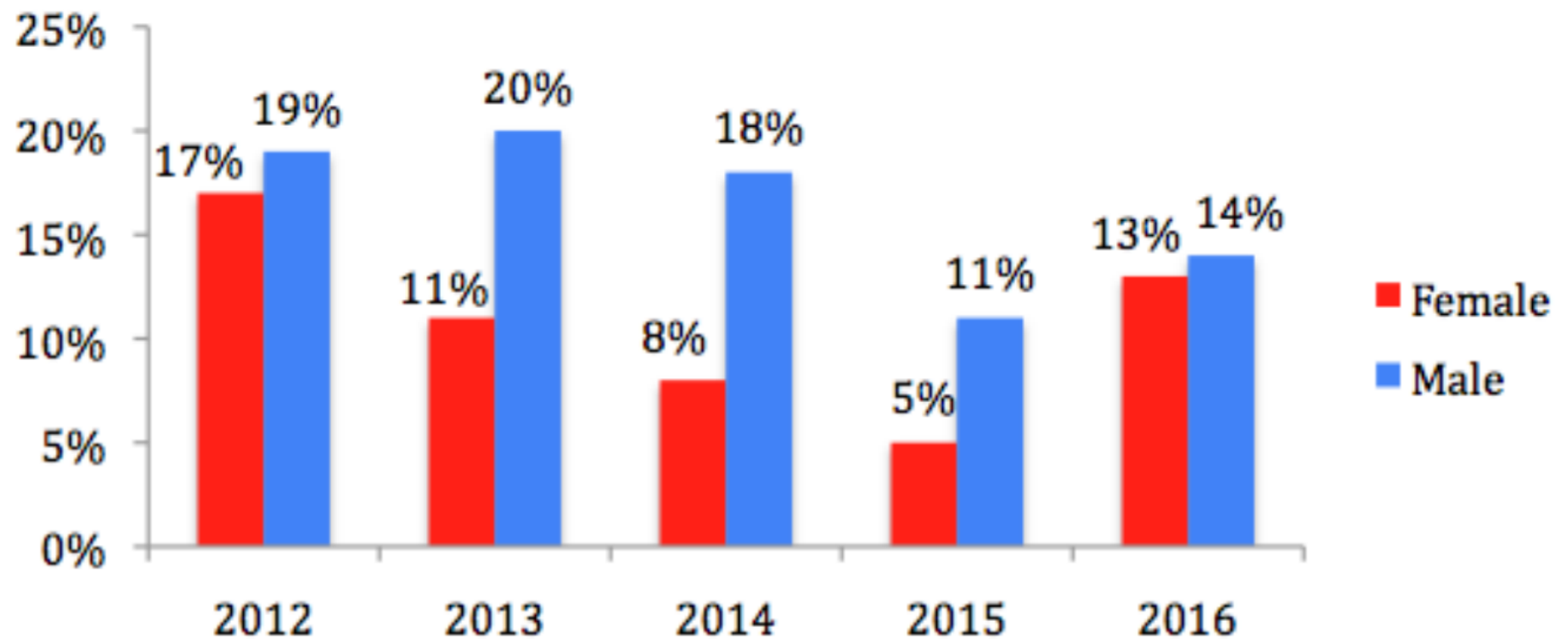
Total Enrollment: Gender



4 Year College Matriculation: 5 Year Gender Trend

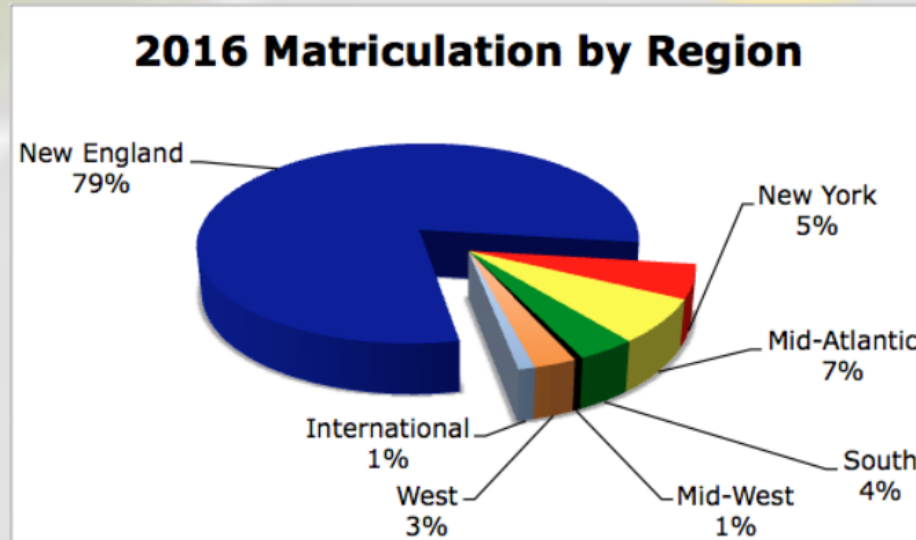


2 Year College Matriculation: 5 Year Gender Trend

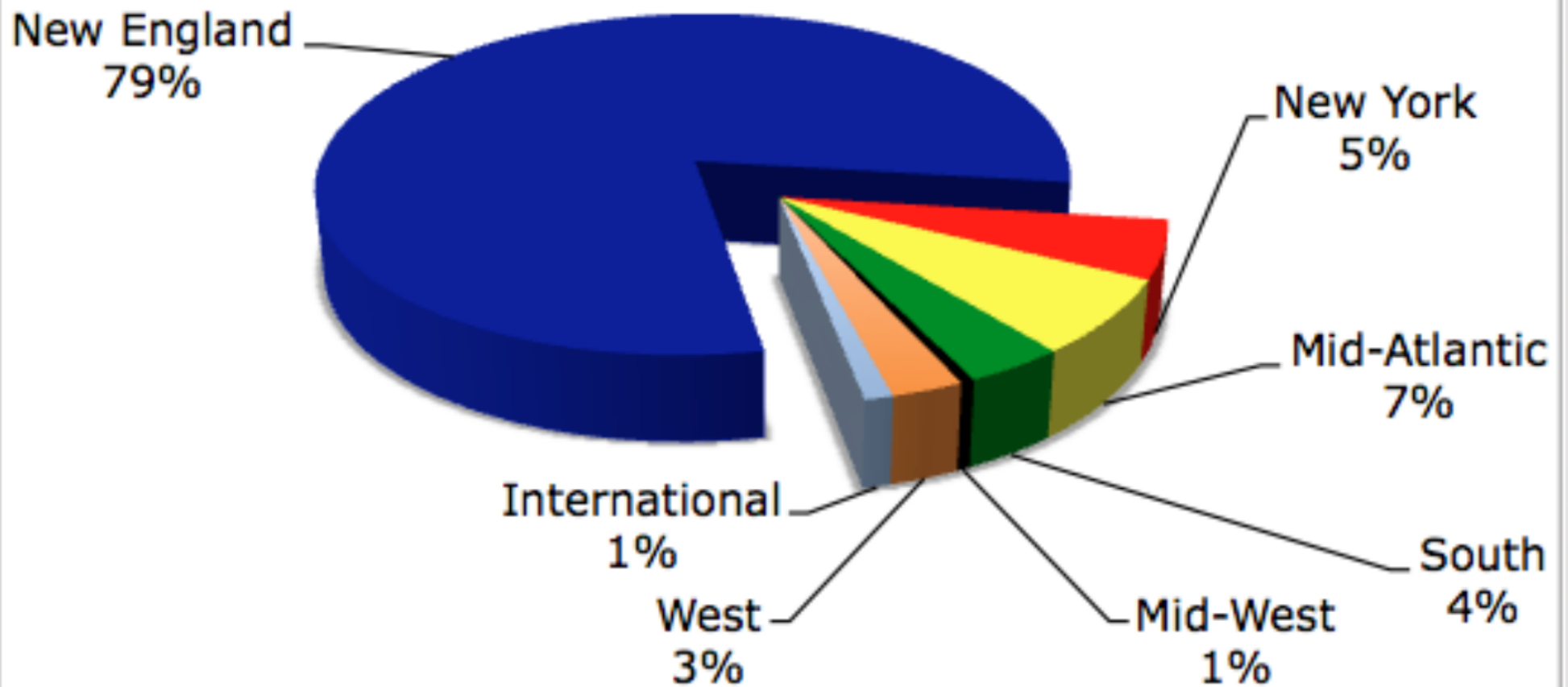


Geographic Breakdown

2016 Matriculation by Region

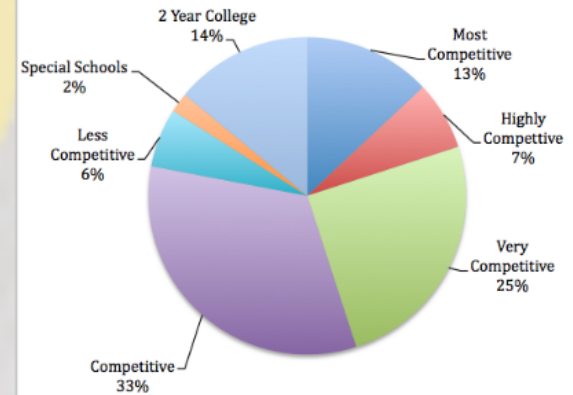

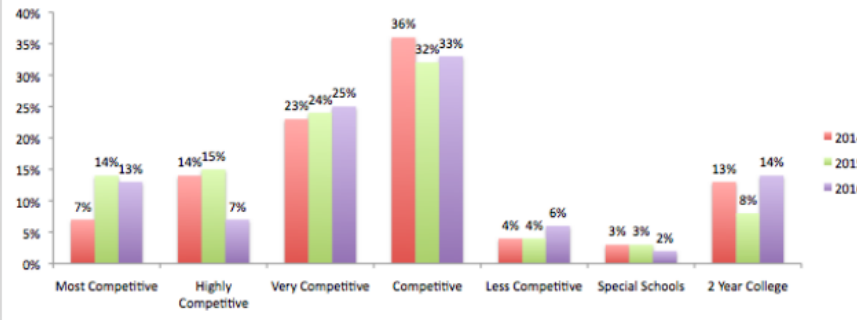

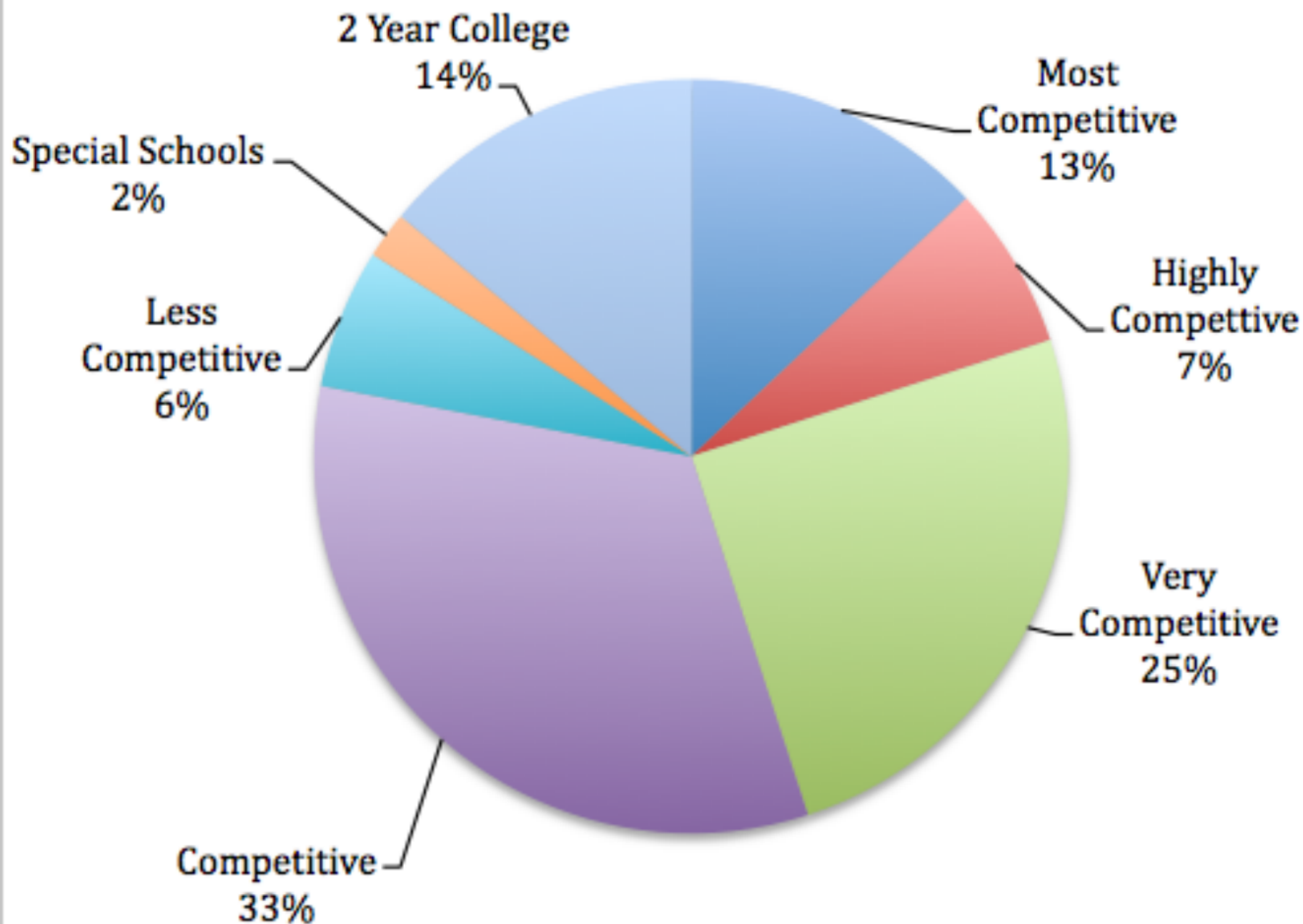
Selectivity: 3 Year Trend



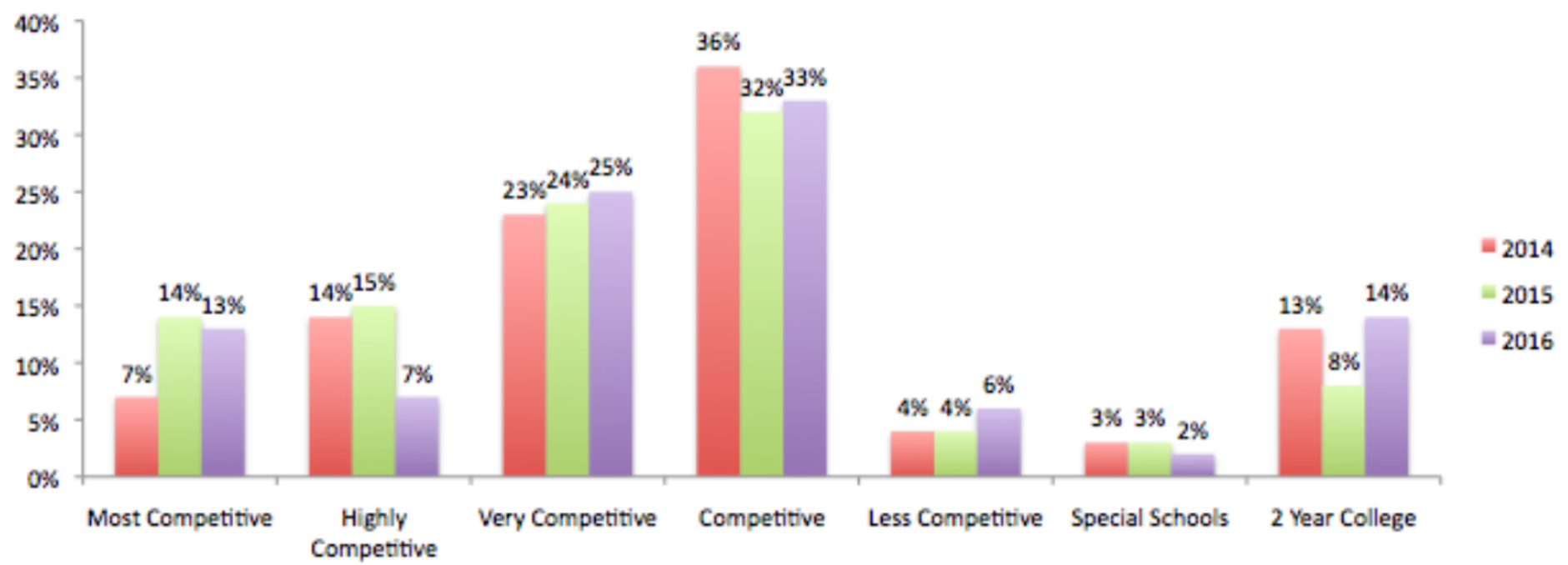

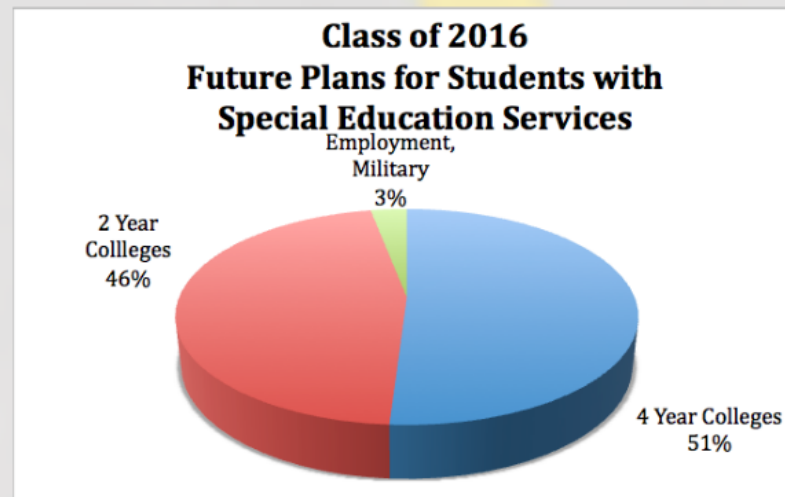

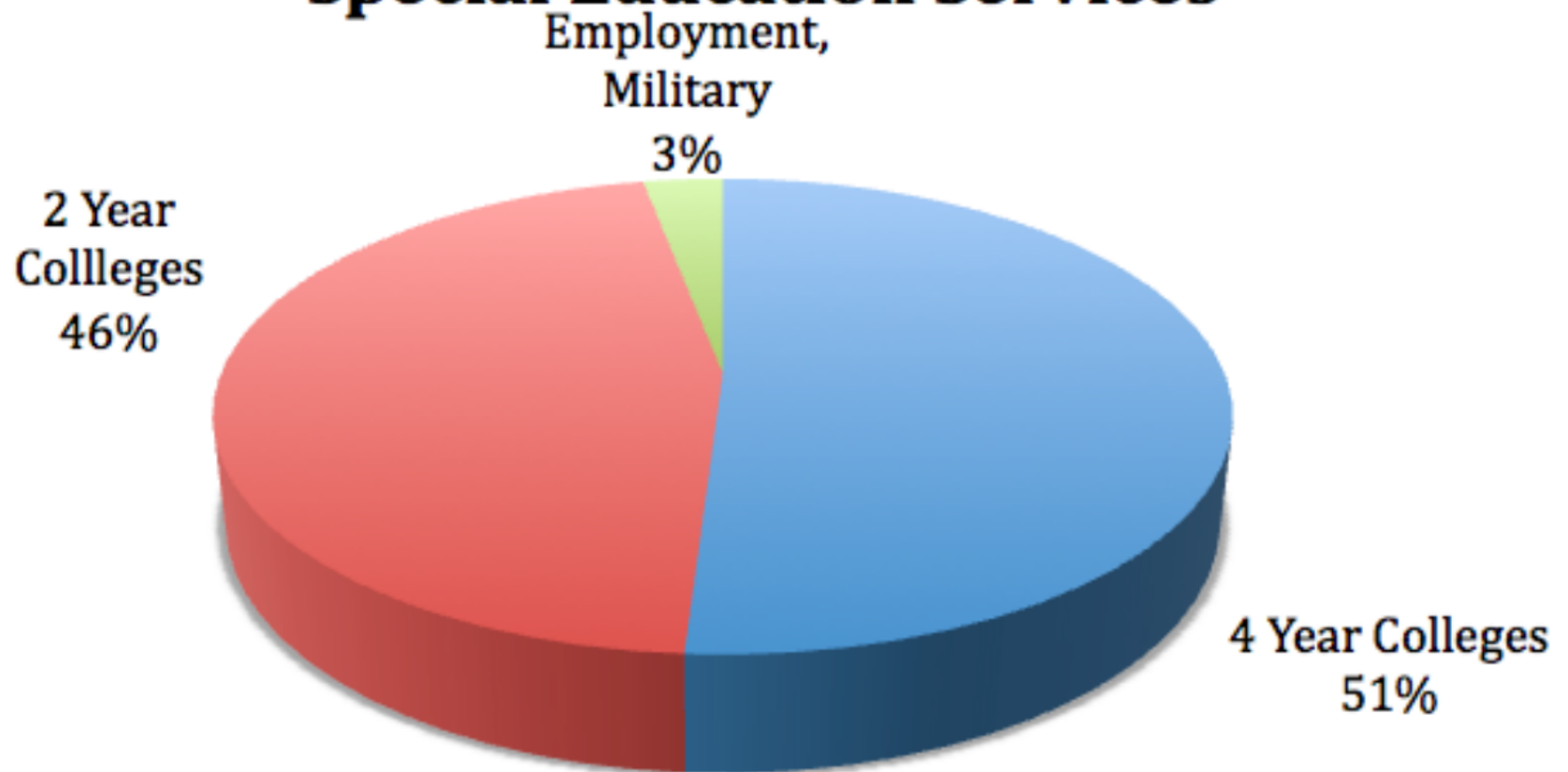
Future Plans of Students Receiving Special Education Services

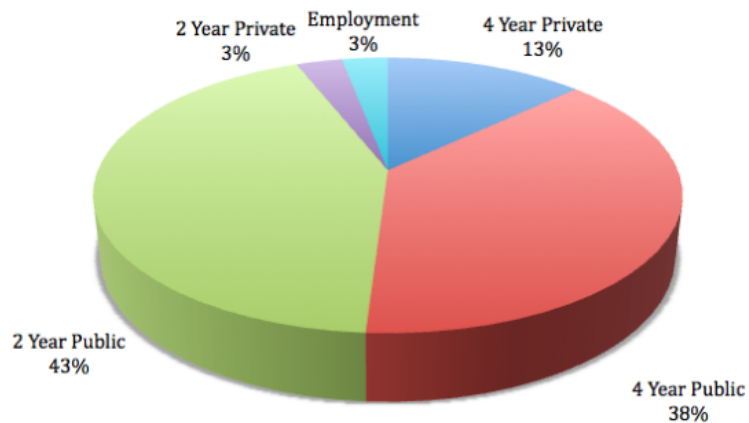

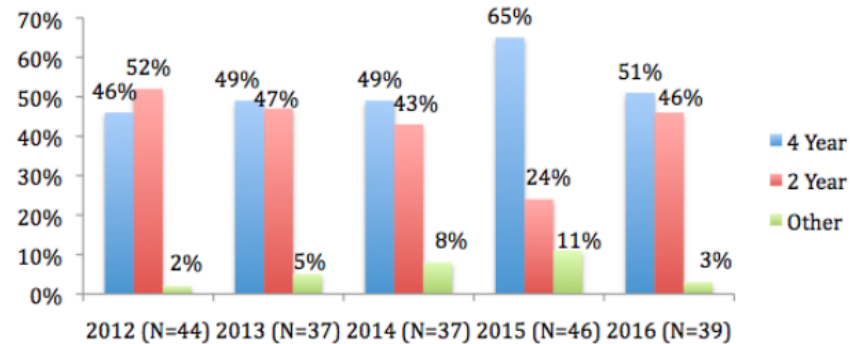
Public & Private Matriculations of Students Receiving Special Education Services

Class of 2016 Students with Special Education Services



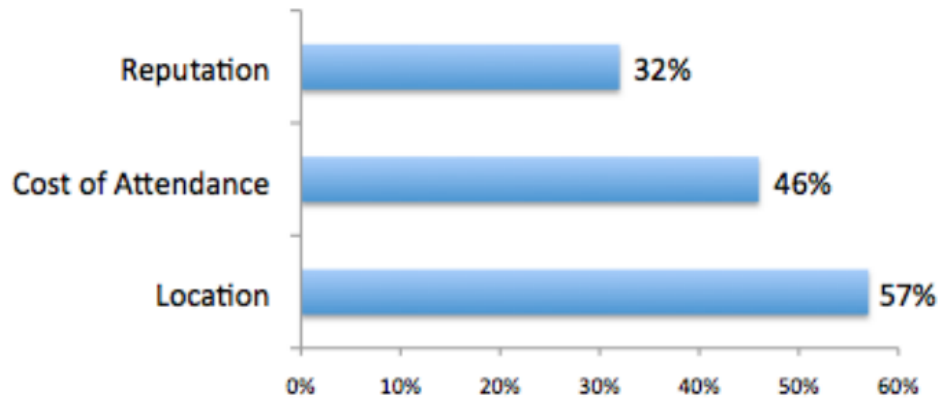
Students Receiving Special Education Services Matriculation: 5 Year Trend



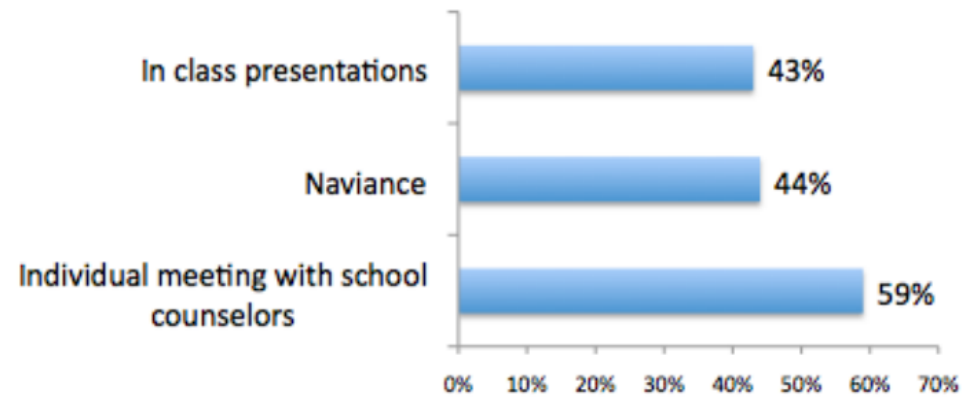

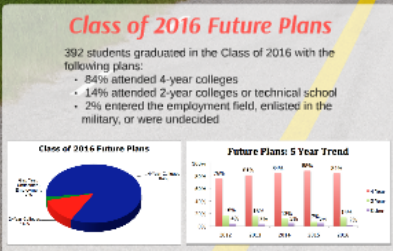
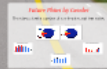
