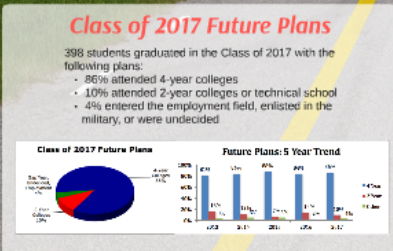

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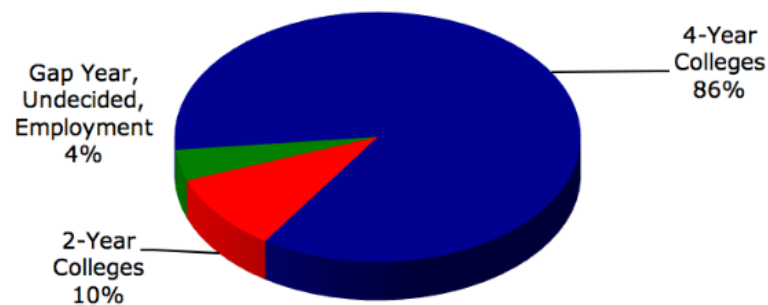
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Class of 2017 Future Plans

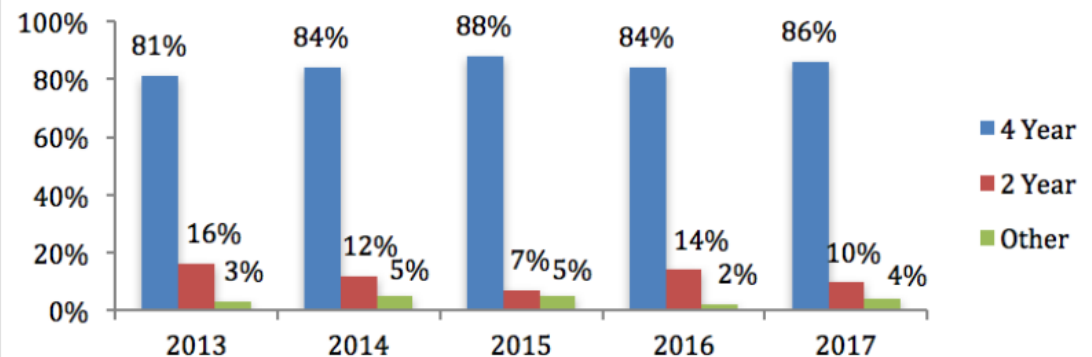
398 students graduated in the Class of 2017 with the following plans:

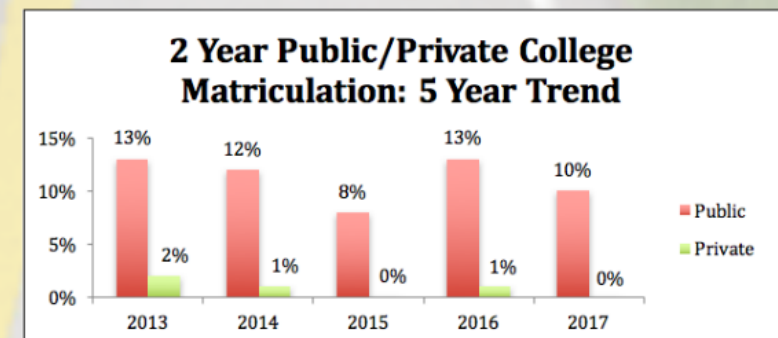
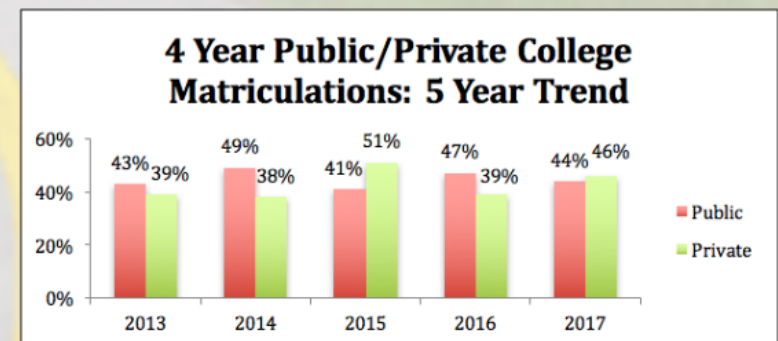
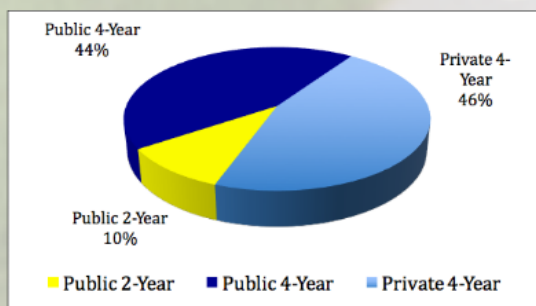
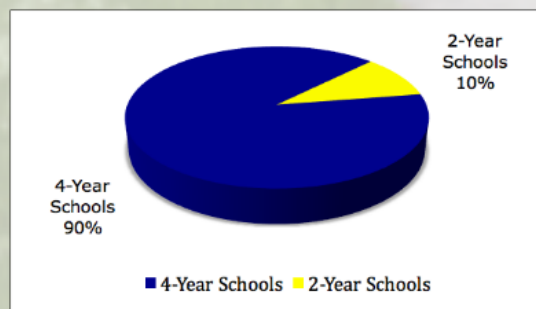


Future Plans: 5 Year Trend



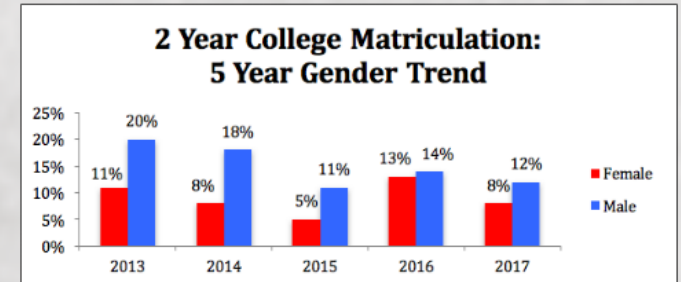
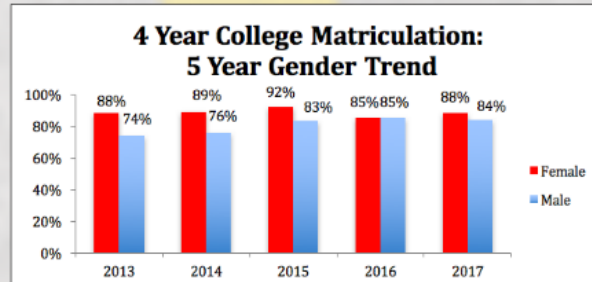
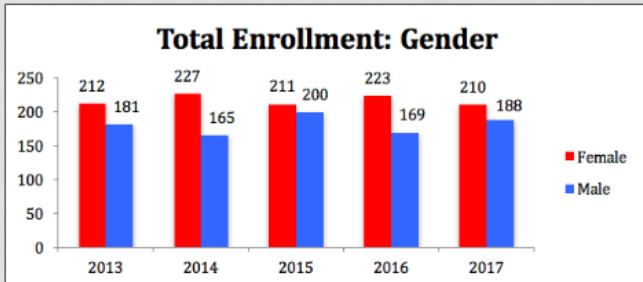
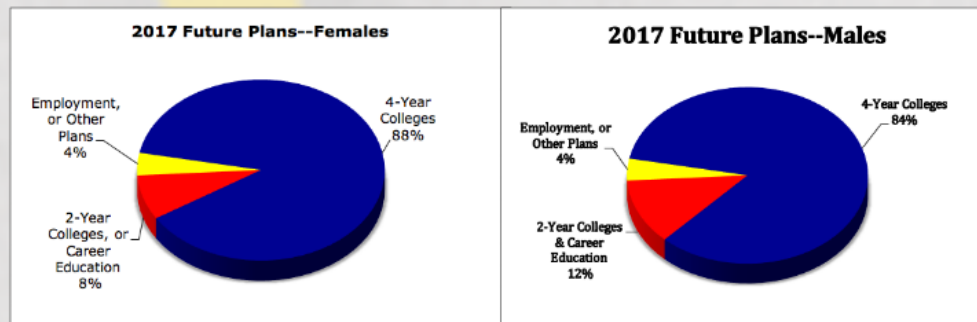
Public and Private 2- and 4-Year Matriculations

- 86% attended 4-year colleges and 14% attended 2-year colleges or technical schools
- 60% attended public colleges and universities; 40% attended private colleges and universities



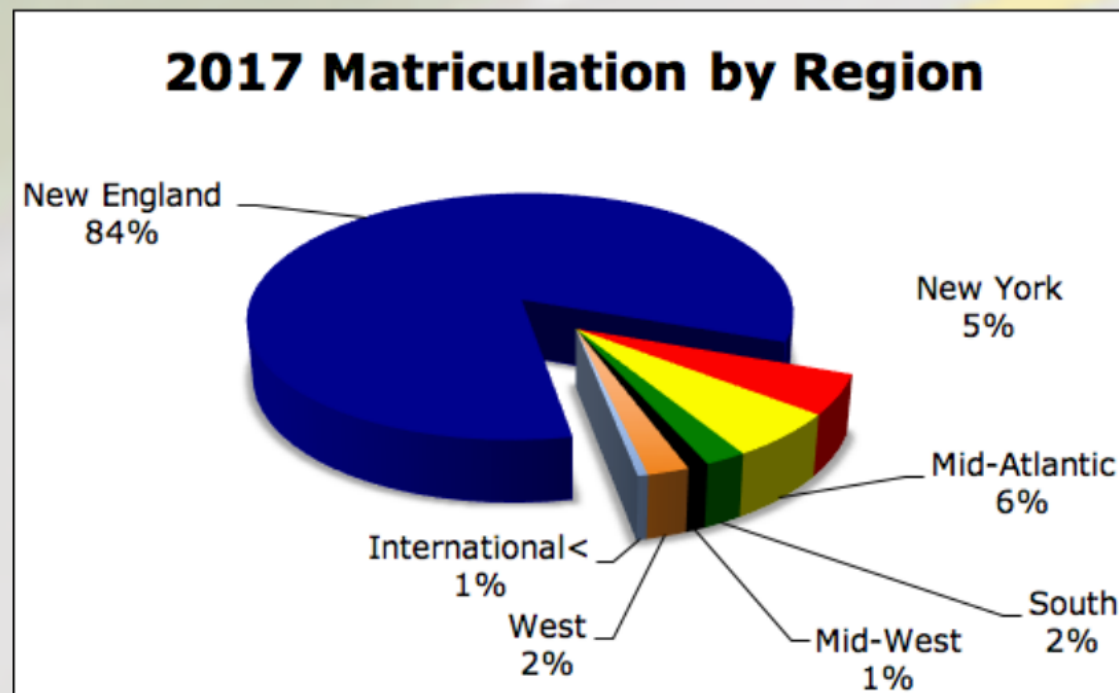
Future Plans by Gender

Geographic Breakdown

- Seniors in the Class of 2017 were accepted to 254 different colleges and universities in 33 different states, Canada, and Scotland.
- Seniors in the Class of 2017 enrolled in 122 different colleges and universities in 26 different states, District of Columbia, Canada, and Scotland.

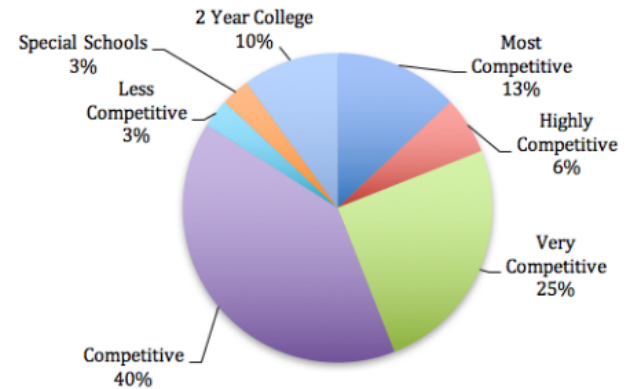

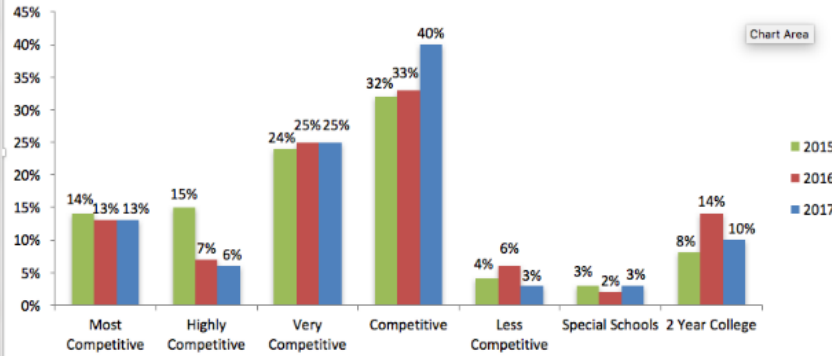

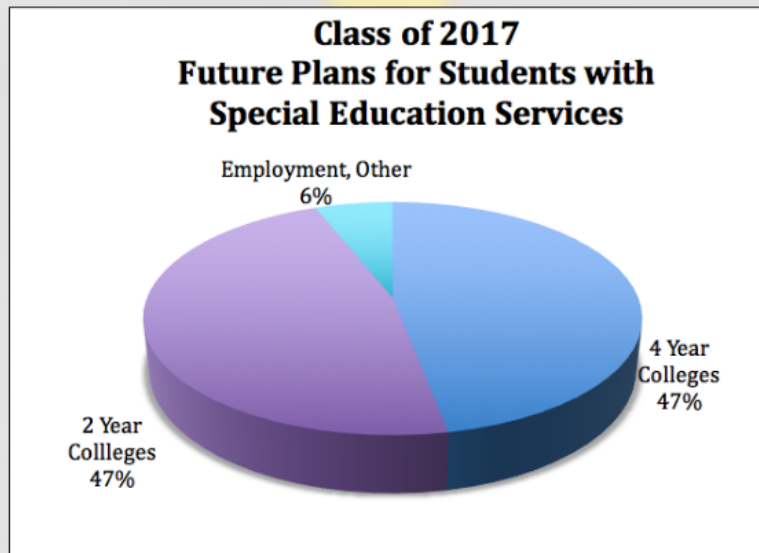


Selectivity: 3 Year Trend



Future Plans of Students Receiving Special Education Services

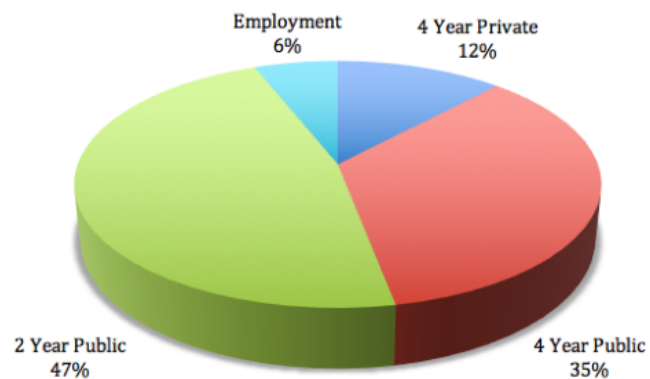
- Thirty-four students (9%) in the Class of 2017 received special education services. Of these 34 students:

 - 6% entered the employment field or military



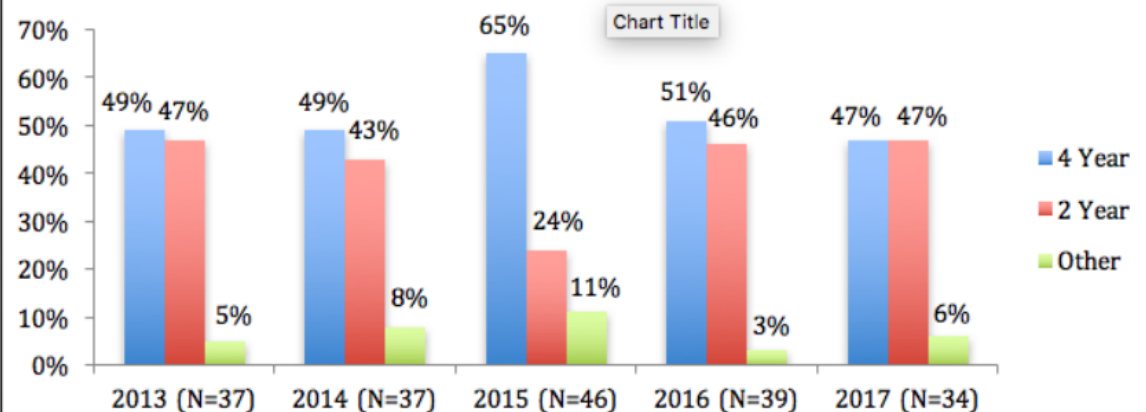
Public & Private Matriculations of Students Receiving Special Education Services

Class of 2017 Students with Special Education Services



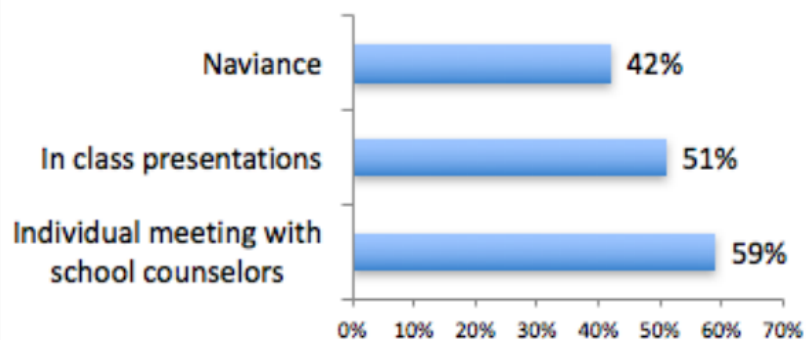
Students Receiving Special Education Services Matriculation: 5 Year Trend



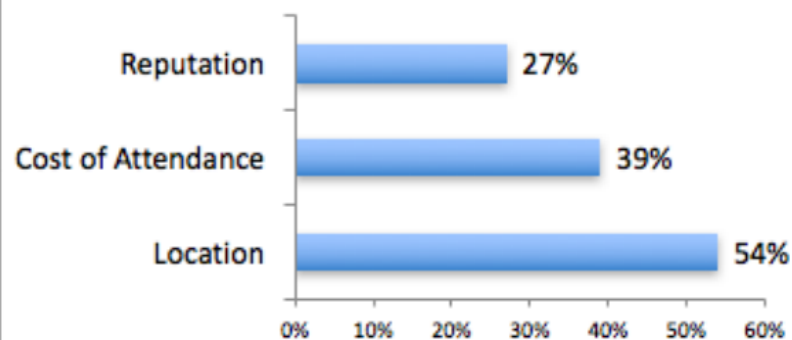

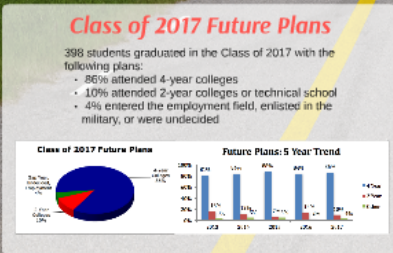
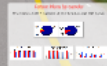
