

Shrewsbury's Profile of a Graduate



What is SEL?

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to:

- **understand and manage emotions**
- **set and achieve positive goals**
- **feel and show empathy for others**
- **establish and maintain positive relationships**
- **make responsible decisions.**

“SEL is defined more specifically as ‘a process for helping children and even adults develop the fundamental skills for life effectiveness (including)...recognizing and managing...emotions, developing caring and concern for others, establishing positive relationships, making responsible decisions, and handling challenging situations constructively and ethically.’”


