Shrewsbury Historical Society presents "Trailblazers by Timing-Activists by Choice" by Lynne McKenney Lydick on Wednesday, October 26th at 7:00 p.m. at the Shrewsbury Historical Society (17 Church Road). Join Lynne McKenney Lydick as she takes us back to the days before 1920 and the passage of the 19th Amendment. Actor Lynne McKenney Lydick has performed with the Worcester Women's History Project and at schools, libraries and historical societies throughout the community. She was the recipient of the YWCA's Katharine F. Erskine Award for Arts and Culture.
