The Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging Committee was established by the Select Board August 23, 2022 alongside their issuance of a commitment statement to Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging. The Board is seeking one (1) high school-aged Shrewsbury resident junior or senior student to serve on the committee for a one year term set to expire June 30, 2023. The Committee shall be comprised of an intentionally diverse group of seven (7) members appointed by the Select Board.

The mission of the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging Committee (DEIBC) is to support and foster an inclusive and equitable community that enhances belonging for all residents. The committee will act in an advisory capacity to the Select Board and Town Manager and provide feedback to local governing bodies, boards, and committees on related topics.
