4. Please Note – SAT Prep Course

The Shrewsbury High School Spring SAT Prep Course will be offered once again through Shrewsbury High School. The course will begin the week of February 6th and run through the week of March 27th. Participants may choose between Monday and Wednesday night classes. Classes will meet remotely from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. for a total of seven night sessions. Test-taking strategies will be emphasized in this class. Class size will be kept small, allowing for a great deal of individual attention. Enrollment is strictly on a first-come first-served basis; the course is open to juniors and seniors. Students will also take two full-length SAT exams, which provides reinforcement for skills taught during the course and test-taking experience.

The cost of the program is \$260 for Shrewsbury residents and \$300 for non-Shrewsbury residents. This class will run only if there is sufficient demand. 1. Please Note – Shrewsbury Council on Aging's Day Break Respite Program (New)

Shrewsbury Council on Aging is offering caregivers the opportunity to participate in our free pilot Day Break Respite Program. Are you a caregiver of an older adult (age 60 or over) family member, friend, or loved one? We know that it can be difficult for caregivers to find the time for their own personal self-care and attend to their own needs. The cost of respite services can be a major barrier to taking advantage of such services. Imagine having three hours of personal time while your loved one spends time socializing and engaging in fun activities with friends - old and new.

The Senior Center will host twice-monthly 3-hour respite sessions on the first and third Friday of each month, with the last session on June 16th. We also have available free respite at off-site locations. Each session includes lunch for recipients and activities that facilitate social connection and exercise/movement.
