5. Please Note – SAT Prep Course

The Shrewsbury High School Spring SAT Prep Course will be offered once again through Shrewsbury High School. The course will begin the week of February 7th and run through the week of March 28th. Participants may choose between Monday and Thursday night classes.

Classes will meet remotely from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. for a total of seven night sessions. Test-taking strategies will be emphasized in this class. Class size will be kept small, allowing for a great deal of individual attention.

Enrollment is strictly on a first-come, first-served basis; the course is open to juniors and seniors. Students will also take two full-length SAT exams, which provides reinforcement for skills taught during the course and test-taking experience. The cost of the program is \$220 for Shrewsbury residents and \$250 for non-Shrewsbury residents. This class will run only if there is sufficient demand. From Slavery to Civil Rights

On Thursday, January 27th at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom, the Shrewsbury Public Library presents musician/educator Roger Tincknell's virtual one-hour program exploring African-American history through music. The concert will begin with African drumming and a welcoming song in Swahili, then continue chronologically with slave songs, spirituals, work songs, and blues, concluding with songs from the 1960s Civil Rights movement. Examples of some uniquely African-American musical styles such as R&B, Motown, and jazz will be included. The audience will be invited to sing, move, dance, and play percussion instruments. A Q & A period will follow the program. This program is supported in part by a grant from the Shrewsbury Cultural Council, a local agency, which is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency. We'll make a patent copy of our fingerprints using ink, study them for their unique patterns, and then solve a mini mystery based on fingerprints. 3. Please Note – SYFS Parent Support Group

SYFS is now offering a new session of our 6-week support group for parents who have children who are struggling with depression, anxiety, or other mental health challenges. Parents are often focused almost entirely on the needs of their children, sometimes to the point that they ignore their own needs and feelings. This group is a chance to address your needs. We will cover topics including the importance of parental self-care and parental social support, parental feelings of guilt, grief, and shame, as well as accessing and navigating the treatment system. This group will be co-led by two master's level clinicians and will be free of charge.

Mr. Noone is a docent for Preservation Worcester and was previously a member of the Worcester Historical Commission. He holds graduate degrees from Syracuse University, and is currently a music teacher for the Worcester Public Schools. Interestingly, his home borders Green Hill Park, final resting place of Bathsheba Spooner.
