On Tuesday, February 15th at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom, the Shrewsbury Public Library presents actor-storyteller Lou Del Bianco portraying Abraham Lincoln as Civil War President, frontiersman, and storyteller. Lincoln's values, honesty, love of family, thirst for education, sense of justice, and perseverance shine through this dynamic new presentation. Audiences will learn about Lincoln's struggles as President from his suspension of the writ of Habeas Corpus to his stand on Slavery. New light is also shed on his personal struggles, as well. Authentic historical quotations are used throughout. A question and answer period will follow the program. The show has been endorsed by the Lincoln Bicentennial Commission.

Dementia & Alzheimer's: Compassionately & Effectively Working with People with Dementia On Wednesday, February 16th at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom, the Shrewsbury Public Library presents Ryan Dowd leading a workshop on working with people with dementia. The first half of the workshop provides a practical overview of Alzheimer's, for example, how dementia affects specific parts of the brain in different ways. The second half will cover "do's" and "don'ts," including how to use nonverbal cues, closed-ended questions, and a "redirecting" technique. Ryan Dowd has trained organizations around the globe (including libraries, homeless shelters, and hospitals) on how to use empathy-driven enforcement with homeless individuals.

5. Please Note - Shrewsbury Public Library Employment Opportunity (New)

The Shrewsbury Public Library is seeking to fill a Teen Room Aide/Library Page position. This seasonal position runs from September through June each year, with a typical schedule of Fridays 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. and from 12:00 to 3:00 p.m. on school early release days.

The essential functions of this job are:

- Assisting the Teen Librarian in monitoring the Teen Room and adjacent areas
- Communicating policies and usage guidelines to teen visitors
- Assisting at teen events and programs
- Other duties as assigned by the Teen Librarian

Necessary qualifications are:

• Excellent interpersonal skills, especially in relating to teenagers

- Able to provide at least a two-year commitment to the position
- Able to communicate tactfully and respectfully with library visitors
- Desire to work with teens

The pay rate is \$12.54 per hour. Interested applicants should submit a Letter of Interest which briefly describes their interest in the position and any applicable skills or experiences. Like so much else in the new republic, the business of making furniture was changing in the early 1800's. This talk will look at case studies of several early Massachusetts woodworkers to see how rural furniture making transformed from a part-time trade and evolved into different business models by the mid-1800's. The story will also include the triumphant return of the trade to Old Sturbridge Village, a living history museum of the early 19th century.

Tom Kelleher is currently Historian and Curator of Mechanical Arts at Old Sturbridge Village in Sturbridge, Massachusetts. He regularly teaches and demonstrates at museums and historical societies around the country. Tom holds a Master's in history from the University of Connecticut, and writes often for a variety of magazines and journals, including Early American Life.
