Shrewsbury Historical Society presents "Royal Barry Wills: Champion of Cape Cod Style Architecture" by Lorna Condon on Wednesday, May 25th at 7:00 p.m. The event will be available as a virtual program and taped rebroadcast on Shrewsbury channels 28 and 328 and available online at www.shrewsburymediaconnection.org.

Royal Barry Wills was profiled in a 1946 Life magazine article entitled, "Royal Barry Wills: Boston Architect Designs the Kinds of Houses Most Americans Want." The piece went on to describe him as "the nation's most popular architectural author ... and the leading U.S. designer of small traditional houses." In this illustrated talk, Lorna Condon, Senior Curator of Library and Archives at Historic New England, will discuss Willes's influence on American domestic architecture, particularly through his emphasis on the Cape Cod style house. Using material in the Royal Barry Wills and Associates Archives at Historic New England, Lorna will highlight Wills' numerous publications, brilliant marketing skills, and design talent.

As Senior Curator of Library and Archives at Historic New England, Lorna Condon has had the opportunity to work with and expand the organization's significant collections of photographs, books, architectural drawings, manuscripts, and ephemera. In order to share these collections with the public and to raise awareness of them, she has published articles, curated exhibitions, and lectured frequently. Lorna currently serves on the boards of the Ephemera Society of America, the Ticknor Society, and the Amesbury Carriage Museum and on the Massachusetts Historical Society's Collections Committee.
