#### 5. Please Note - Free & Reduced Price Program Fees Application

Some students are eligible to receive reduced program fees if their family household meets specific income thresholds. The <u>free and reduced benefit application</u> is used to determine eligibility for reduced program fees.

Although Massachusetts legislature has provided funding to make meals available at no cost to all students during this school year, **families should still complete a benefit application** if they think they might qualify. This provides data for key funding for academic resources and may also connect families to additional benefits. If eligible, students can potentially receive free busing, reduced activity fees, etc. This data will also support the additional funds provided by the Commonwealth for this pilot. All new and returning students must complete a new application each school year. At any time during the school year, families may apply for reduced program fees. The purpose of the Society shall be to keep alive and increase interest in the history of the Town of Shrewsbury; to collect and preserve items of special value, traditions, and curiosities; to encourage general public interest in its work; and to maintain such personal properties and real estate that may come under the control of the Society.

## 6. Please Note - Shrewsbury Youth and Family Services Annual Appeal

In 2021, a national study revealed that 44% of adolescents had experienced persistent sadness or hopelessness in the prior year, and nearly 20% seriously considered attempting suicide. The US Surgeon General released a public health advisory regarding youth mental health as a result. Similarly, mental health issues in older adults continue to be underestimated and brushed off as a "normal part of aging." Currently, two-thirds of seniors with mental health problems do not get the treatment they need.
