3. Please Note – Shrewsbury Youth and Family Services Parent Support Group (New)

Shrewsbury Youth and Family Services has partnered with your child's school to offer a free Parent Support Group! Parents are often focused almost entirely on the needs of their children, sometimes to the point that they ignore their own needs and feelings. This group is a chance to address your needs. We will cover topics including the importance of managing parental stress, self-care and social support, child mental health, and finding joy in parenting. There will also be two sessions focused on managing screen time as this group is part of our Screen Time Reduction and Education Program (STREP). This group will be co-led by a licensed clinical therapist and Masters level intern and will be free of charge.

Two cohorts will be offered- a Monday group and a Wednesday group. The six week sessions will begin Feb 5 (Monday Group) and Feb 7 (Wednesday Group) and all sessions will be held virtually from 12-12:45pm. We will not meet during February break. Shrewsbury Historical Society Upcoming Programs

- January 24th at 7:00 p.m. at Shrewsbury Historical Society (17 Church Road): "Shrewsbury Charitable Society" by Tom Kelleher
 - Early Americans sought to improve their society and the world by organizing into voluntary associations to address particular problems. Shrewsbury, Massachusetts was no different. In 1832 several women of Shrewsbury formed a Charitable Society, banding together to socialize and aid their less fortunate neighbors. Based on the work of the late Jack Larkin, long time Chief Historian at Old Sturbridge Village, this presentation will look at the Shrewsbury Charitable Society during its first decade, its work, and the women who formed it.
 - Tom Kelleher is currently Historian and Curator of Mechanical Arts at Old Sturbridge Village in Sturbridge, Massachusetts. He regularly teaches and demonstrates at museums and historical societies around the country. Tom holds a Master's degree in history from the University of Connecticut, and writes often for a variety of magazines and journals, including Early American Life.
