This week, on January 12th, the SHS Lunch and Learn guest speaker is Ms. Lisa Dagnello. Ms. Dagnello is the State Clinical Director for the MAT (medication assisted treatment) program with

Spectrum Health Systems, working in the MA Department of Corrections. The program she oversees provides medication for addiction treatment to the incarcerated population who have a diagnosed Opioid use disorder and/or alcohol use disorder. Her position oversees all clinical operations for the contract. She is a licensed mental health clinician and a licensed alcohol drug clinician. Ms. Dagnello is also certified in trauma therapy. She has been in the field of addiction and mental health since 2006 and primarily has worked in correctional settings but has also worked in residential and outpatient centers.
