1. Please Note – Shrewsbury Public Schools Offers Meals at No Cost for Students

Shrewsbury Public Schools will be participating in the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program. As part of this program, Shrewsbury Public Schools will offer healthy meals every school day. The Massachusetts legislature has provided funding to make meals available at no cost to all students during the school year 2023-2024, regardless of household income. However, families should still complete a Meal Benefit Application as this provides data for key funding for academic resources and may also connect families to additional benefits. 4. Please Note – Shrewsbury Public Library Employment Opportunity

The Shrewsbury Public Library is hiring a part-time Youth Services Assistant. This is a non-benefited position. The Youth Services Assistant will be part of our dynamic Youth Services team and work in conjunction with the other team members and be responsible for planning and implementing fun, educational, and STEAM-focused programs for children 0-18. 5. Please Note – Shrewsbury Public Library: Change in Rules for Age of Students Allowed Without an Adult

Please note: Students who are in Grade 6 or younger may not be at the library without a parent or parent's representative, and students in Grades 7 & 8 may only access the library unattended without a parent or parent representative for a maximum of two hours.

We've had many discussions with our library staff and community partners to try to create a safe environment for middle school aged kids. We restricted the students to the young adult and

community commons sections of the library, offered age-appropriate activities, and volunteered to help monitor and supervise the students during the time they were in the library. These efforts did help somewhat; but, put simply, we cannot safely supervise and manage the number of students at the library. Behavioral issues also continue to impact overall safety and disturb other patrons' use of the library. There is also concern for students' safety while walking to the library and through the center of town and in the parking lot, as many children have been observed to disregard traffic.

At a properly posted public meeting, the Board of Library Trustees voted unanimously on June 20, 2023 to change the Child Safety Policy regarding when children can use the library building without adult supervision in response to the above. The updated policy, effective July 1, 2023 reads:

Children through grade six must be continually attended and supervised by a parent or parent's representative while in the library. Children in grades seven and eight may be left unattended for a maximum of two hours.

6. Save the Date – Holy Cross Crusader Community Festival, August 24th (New)

Holy Cross Athletics will be hosting its first-ever Crusader Community Festival on Thursday, August 24th on the Hart Turf beginning at 4:30 p.m. Attendees will have the opportunity for a meet and greet with some of our student-athletes from multiple sports, and a chance to be introduced to the sports they play and to participate in other fun activities!

This event is free and open to the public, and includes activities for all in attendance, such as on-field skill stations run by Holy Cross student-athletes and photo stations.

Participants are encouraged to wear sneakers and casual clothing in anticipation of light on-field activities. Parking is available in the Luth Athletic Complex parking lot. Those looking to participate must <u>register</u> in advance of the event. Fans are encouraged to register as early as possible - the first 100 registrants will receive a free Holy Cross foam finger!

Following the festival, all participants are encouraged to watch the men's soccer team take on Manhattan at 6:00 p.m.

All children (aged 12 or younger) in attendance will receive one free ticket to the Holy Cross football home opener on Saturday, September 2nd at 2:00 p.m. against Merrimack. Parents/guardians and all additional family members will be able to buy a ticket at a discounted rate in celebration of Community Day. Discounted tickets will be available for purchase on site, or through a special link that will be sent out following the event.

This event is organized by "Nap Briye," a non-profit organization with a mission to create a digital platform to provide good quality, free, and accessible education to underprivileged children in Haiti. Our mission is to reduce the percentage of people who do not have access to education and increase the literacy rate in Haiti. The Haitian educational system yields the lowest total rate in the education realm of the Western Hemisphere. Despite being the first black independent nation in the world, Haiti's economic and social development continues to be hindered by political instability, increasing violence, and unprecedented levels of insecurity, which exacerbate fragility. Education is the key to success. Without education, there will be more insecurity due to delinquency. With education, we will have hope for a better future.
