### Financial Projections Subcommittee report - Part 2

School Committee members Dale Magee and John Samia are serving on the Financial Projections Subcommittee. This past Wednesday evening, Mr. Samia presented the subcommittee's second report, outlining financial projections over the next five years, which show a challenging structural gap between potential revenue and costs. #### Public Hearing on Beal Building Project: February 14 at 6:00pm

The Beal Early Childhood Center Building Committee is holding a public hearing on Tuesday, February 14 at 6:00pm in the Old Selectmen's Room (Conference Room B) of the Municipal Office Building at 100 Maple Ave to gather written and oral comments from interested citizens on the work of the Committee as it prepares to begin the feasibility study phase of the Mass. ### **School Committee feedback opportunities**

The School Committee welcomes feedback from the public on the following topics:

• School Calendar for 2017-2018: A draft of next year's school calendar was presented to the School Committee at its meeting this past Wednesday. It follows a similar format to recent years, reflecting the work of last year's Calendar Committee made up of parents and staff. Please note that, as there is no election day this coming November, the parent conference day for Preschool - Grade 8 that is also a professional development day for SHS staff is proposed for Thursday, November 9, which would abut Friday, November 10 when Veterans Day would be observed. You can see the draft calendar <a href="here">here</a>. The School Committee will vote on the calendar at their next regular meeting on March 1.

- Tuitions & Fees for 2017-2018: A memo on tuitions and fees and a projection of
  potential fees for next year were presented to the School Committee at its last meeting,
  illustrating what some level of increase could entail. No recommendation has been
  made at this time, and the School Committee will further consider whether to make any
  adjustments to tuitions and fees at their next regular meeting on March 1.
- Public Hearing on FY 2018 School Department Budget: A public hearing on the
   Superintendent's Recommended Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 will be held at the School
   Committee meeting on March 1, which begins at 7:00pm in the Selectmen's Meeting
   Room at Town Hall (100 Maple Ave.). The School Committee welcomes feedback on
   the budget recommendation as the district administration works through the process of
   creating a reduction plan that will be presented on March 15 that recognized the existing
   funding gap.
