YOUR WBLA EXPERIENCE



Review the steps below to learn more about your program experience, supported by Work-Based Learning Alliance.



1) TELL US ABOUT YOURSELF

Complete the Registration Form to let WBLA know your areas of interests, industry preferences, and schedule availability.

2) CONNECT WITH YOUR ADVISOR

Your WBLA advisor will help you get ready for your program, and be your first point of contact should you need anything throughout your experience.



3) MAKE IT OFFICIAL

You will complete all your onboarding paperwork through WBLA so that you are ready to start your program and get paid!



4) GET ON BOARD

Attend an onboarding session to learn all about your program experience, meet your team, and say hello to your industry mentor.



5) WORK IT

Work as part of a consulting team to solve a real business challenge for your industry mentor. WBLA programs are completely virtual, so you don't have to worry about finding a ride (or catching the bus!) to connect with your coworkers.



6) BUILD YOUR PROFESSIONAL SKILLS

Build your skills by working on a valuable project, observing business meetings, and getting feedback on your progress from your industry mentor. Your typical schedule will require 25 hours per week of your time.



7) PRESENT YOUR FINAL PRODUCT

You and your teammates will present your final project solution to your industry mentor. This presentation will demonstrate all the work your team has done throughout your program.



8) CELEBRATE!

Congratulations! You have completed your program, something that truly sets you apart from your peers. Now it's time to share your accomplishment on your resume and platforms such as LinkedIn.



FAQ

When do programs start?

- Summer Internships (25 hours per week)
 - July 1 - July 26
 - July 29 - August 23

- CAD Engineering Project (7 hours per week)
 - July 8 - July 26

- Cybersecurity Project (7 hours per week)
 - August 5 - August 23

How will I be paid?

WBLA will process your stipend payment over the course of your program. Students are paid \$15 per hour. The pay schedule will be communicated prior to your program.

What is expected of me?

You will complete all work virtually over the course of your program. Your exact schedule will vary based on the length of your program and your industry mentor's availability. You will work with a team of students, some of whom may be from other schools. To successfully complete your program and receive all stipend payments, you will need to:

- Attend all meetings
- Submit all assignments
- Attend and present at your final presentation
