On March 12, 2020, Governor Baker issued an Executive Order modifying certain requirements of the Open Meeting Law, to enable public bodies to carry out their responsibilities while adhering to public health recommendations regarding social distancing.

The Executive Order relieves public bodies from the requirement in the Open Meeting Law that meetings be conducted in a public place that is open and physically accessible to the public, provided that the public body makes provision to ensure public access to the deliberations of the public body through adequate, alternative means. "Adequate, alternative means" may include, without limitation, providing public access through telephone, internet, or satellite enabled audio or video conferencing or any other technology that enables the public to clearly follow the proceedings of the public body in real time. A municipal public body that for reasons of economic hardship and despite best efforts is unable to provide alternative means of public access in real time may instead post on its municipal website a full and complete transcript, recording, or other comprehensive record of the proceedings as soon as practicable afterwards.

In addition, all members of a public body may participate in a meeting remotely; the Open Meeting Law's requirement that a quorum of the body and the chair be physically present at the meeting location is suspended.

All other provisions of the Open Meeting Law, such as the requirements regarding posting notice of meetings and creating and maintaining accurate meeting minutes, as well as the limited, enumerated purposes for holding an executive session, remain in effect.

While for this meeting the School Committee and members of the School Department administrative team will physically meet at the location listed above, members of the public may not attend in person. If a member of the public wishes to participate remotely in the Public Participation portion of the meeting or the Public Hearing on Fiscal Year 2022 Budget & School Choice, they should contact the Committee Chair, Ms. Sandra Fryc, by sending an email to schoolcommittee@shrewsbury.k12.ma.us.

B. Update on School District's Response to the Pandemic & Possibilities for Reopening for Full, In-Person Learning: Report & Potential Vote to Request a Waiver from the Dept. of Elementary & Secondary Education Regarding the Timeline for Return of Grade 5 to Full, In-Person Learning Program

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Dr. Sawyer and members of the leadership team will provide an update on the school district's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and possibilities for reopening for full, in-person learning. Dr. Sawyer will also request the School Committee to vote to request a waiver from the Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE) that would treat Grade 5 in Shrewsbury as a middle school grade, so that the timeline for reopening 5th grade for full, in-person learning is synchronized with the other middle school grades (6, 7, & 8) who are required to return to this mode by April 28, instead of with elementary school grades (K-4) which are required to return by April 5. DESE's new mandate includes Grade 5 as an elementary grade, and has indicated that a waiver is required for districts where Grade 5 is part of the middle school model, as is the case in Shrewsbury.

ACTION RECOMMENDED:

That the School Committee hear the report and take such action as it deems in the best interest of the school system.

That the School Committee vote that the district request a waiver from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary & Secondary Education so that Grade 5 may be aligned with the other middle school level grades regarding the timeline for a return to full, in-person education.

Re: Recommended school year calendar for 2021-2022

Enclosed with this memorandum is a proposed calendar for the 2021-2022 school year. It follows state law regarding not holding school on <u>legal holidays</u>, you will see that the approach used for scheduling vacation periods is the same as in recent years, which is structured according to the <u>recommendations made in January 2016</u> by a Calendar Committee composed of staff and parents. However, there are some key differences that this calendar represents due to the unique situation we have for next year.

Because of the uncertainty of whether we will still face any public health restrictions upon the opening of the school year, and because we very much hope to be opening a new elementary school, our leadership team is in strong agreement that moving New Teacher Orientation two days later to provide more time in August to prepare, along with having two professional development days in addition to the traditional opening day for staff prior to the students returning, will be very beneficial for a successful launch of the school year. This would result in the first day of school for students being September 7, the day after Labor Day.

For decades, we have begun the school year for students on the Tuesday prior to Labor Day, with either three or four days of school happening prior to the holiday (depending on whether we also have a professional development day during that first week). This results in not going as deep into June to hold the mandated 180 days of school. This draft calendar has the 180th day on Friday, June 17, a few days later than typical. While the number of snow days each year is unpredictable, there is some more risk of going deeper into June than usual to complete the school year. However, it is possible that the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education may continue to allow remote learning days to be held in lieu of snow days even after the pandemic ends, which would give the district a measure of control regarding when the last day would fall, and which is something we will consider next year when that has been clarified by the state. Regardless, the leadership team believes the benefits of having more time on the front end of the school year clearly outweigh the few extra days added to the end of the year.

Something new in the calendar for 2021-2022 is that there is a new state holiday: Juneteenth Independence Day. This holiday will fall on June 19 each year. For the current school year, this is a Saturday, and therefore will have no impact on the school calendar. June 19 falls on a Sunday in 2022. Because Massachusetts state law

mandates that state holidays that fall on a Sunday must be observed the next day on Monday, we cannot then hold school on Monday, June 20, 2022. This would affect the calendar if we have any need to cancel school for a snow day or other reason, as the first "make up" day beyond the scheduled last day of school on June 17, 2022 would then need to be Tuesday, June 21, 2022.

Finally, a change in language is also included in this draft. The School Committee has in the past received some communication from the parent community regarding adding Indigenous Peoples' Day to the calendar. It is my recommendation that this title be added to the Columbus Day holiday entry, so that it reads "Columbus Day/Indigenous Peoples' Day." This approach includes the legal name of the holiday under Massachusetts law that requires schools to be closed on this day, while also recognizing that Indigenous Peoples' Day has become a more widely accepted and known holiday that honors and commemorates the native peoples of America. Given our school district's efforts to increase the sense of belonging and inclusivity for our students, families, and staff, I believe this language addition is appropriate.

I look forward to answering any questions you may have regarding the recommended calendar for the 2021-2022 school year.
