

## COVID-19 Closure Update

A presentation to the School Committee *April 15, 2020* 



#### **Key Messages**

- 1) The **health & well-being** of students, families, & staff is **priority #1**.
- 2) This is an extraordinary time in history, and everyone in our community has a collective responsibility to respond to this challenge.
- 3) Even though our schools are closed, we continue to support our students, families, and staff from a distance and empower continued student learning.



 All Massachusetts public & private PreK-Grade 12 schools are closed at least through Friday, May 1, with the earliest return date of Monday, May 4. The school closure is widely expected to be extended – potential for an update coming early next week.



- Our school district is functioning remotely:
  - Meals are being provided to students who need them (pick up & delivery)
  - Remote learning program has been expanded twice to current iteration
  - Technology is being provided to families who require access or devices (to date, 58 iPads with WiFi & 9 iPads with cellular service have been distributed)
  - Report cards at elementary & middle levels issued for Trimester 2




- Our school district is functioning remotely (continued):
  - Finance, Operations, Human Resources and other district-level responsibilities are being carried out
  - Online professional development for paraprofessionals is ongoing;
    online professional development for educators' use of remote learning tools evolving
  - Construction of new Beal School continuing, but slowed



- April school vacation has been modified:
  - Monday, April 20 is Patriots Day; no school business or remote learning
  - April 21, 22, & 23 are now remote learning days; SPS staff and students engaged and these days "count" towards fulfillment of 180-day state requirement
  - Friday, April 24 is a vacation day; no school business or remote learning









#### Supporting the Well-Being of All

- \* SHS health teacher, Erin Burtnyk, teaches two evening classes for all SPS staff. The classes include high intensity interval training, strength, cardio, and kickboxing. (31 staff are registered)
- \* Mindfulness and Racial Justice, focuses on the book, The Inner Work of Racial Justice, and meets on Monday afternoons. The group is led by Marc Waxman (MDI), and support from Maura Egan (ELA teacher at OMS). (20 staff)
- \* Mr. Waxman also facilitates free, online *Introduction to Mindfulness* classes to staff and community members on Wednesdays at 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., and Thursdays at 7 p.m. (45 participants) Jenny Maddox (MDI) is facilitating mindfulness sessions for SHS students at 3 p.m. on Tuesdays (grades 9 and 10) and Thursdays (grades 11 and 12) beginning tomorrow, 4/16.
