Cases this week to date = 0


Cumulative cases since start of school = 40



SPS COVID-19 Data Dashboard


Daily cases on weekdays with weekly count on Mondays


In-Person Cases 2020-2021 School Year By Week






Cases by School (In-Person)

Student Cases by Grade (Hybrid Model) Year to Date






Current Public Health Data MA 7-Day Positivity Rate = 1.25%

As of May 1 (Last Reported)




Suspected In-School Transmission
