



## **Extended School Year (ESY) Services**



## Our ESY Purpose

Shrewsbury Public Schools is committed to ensuring that all students with disabilities receive a free appropriate education (FAPE). For some students, FAPE may require provision of special education services beyond the academic school calendar.

The purpose of ESY is to ensure that a student's IEP benefits achieved during the school year are **not significantly jeopardized** during a lapse in programming in the summer months.

- ESY is not to address IEP goals/benchmarks that a student has failed to achieve during the school year or to provide a new type of educational benefit.
- ESY services should not be equal to the amount of services provided to a student during the school year.



## **Definitions for Eligibility**

**Regression and Recoupment** 

The student is unable to maintain an acquired skill when special education instruction or related services are interrupted.

The student requires a significant amount of time to recoup lost skills.

#### **Nature and Severity of Disability**

The student requires more consistent and highly structured programming without substantial breaks in order to make progress in the identified area of concern.

The student will suffer significant loss of skills or behavior and is more vulnerable to loss when the school program is interrupted.

**Critical Stages/Areas of Learning** 

For this student, an extended break in instruction at this stage will jeopardize critical skill development.

The student will suffer significant loss of skills, behavior, or opportunities essential for the promotion and maintenance of the student's self-sufficiency.



## What's Our ESY Story



The Federal Department of Education indicates that approximately **5% to 15%** of eligible students receive ESY services but this varies from school to school.

2020-2021 school year, SPS has approximately 878 students with IEPs & 89 students in referral.

**Total: 967 SWD** 

In anticipation of this summer: we should be estimated to have a range between:

48 - 145 Students

To date, 280 students have qualified for various services
