Key Messages

- In-person services, based on providing services to our most vulnerable learners






My teacher will be at Sherwood Middle School.




Family Survey Data

- Responses evenly divided across grade levels




Key Data Points: Willingness To Return to School

- 50% of students would return for in-person learning with all students, with 25% not comfortable returning and 25% undecided
- Slightly higher for high school (55% return) and slightly lower for elementary (45% return)

If our school district implements an in-person learning model for all students based upon the state guidance (3 foot physical distancing):



Key Data Points: Willingness To Return to School

- 67% of students would return for an alternating hybrid schedule with fewer students, with 17% not returning and 16% undecided
- Slightly higher for high school (74%), slightly lower for elementary (59%)

If our school district implements a hybrid learning model, where students switch between inperson and remote learning on an alternating schedule and about 50% of the students are present in school each day:



Key Data Points: Transportation

- 43% of responses indicate that students might ride the bus (24% if masks and another 19% if also fewer riders), with 40% not intending to ride and 17% undecided
- 62% of students who would stop riding the bus would be driven to school instead (note: may include some who drove last year)

Key Data Points: Cafeteria

 14% of students would get meals at school most days

26% would get meals occasionally at school

55% would bring lunch from home

More Specific Data Needed: Extended School Care & Athletics

- Many more respondents chose to answer compared to students who would participate
- We will survey those populations more specifically
