Proposed framework for Budget Communications:

Values: Transparency- Modernization- Ease of Comprehension

Budget presentations should cover four main content areas: Who are we? What does public education costs? What outcome do we get for the costs? Where we need to improve/invest in the future?

Who are We?

- 1. Town and school district demographics, including town population, student and staff, with pie chart for current year and/or trend lines to show change over time
- 2. Core mission and values: briefly stated

What public education costs?

- 1. The school Budget is the greatest thing that we invest in: Town Budget/School Budget
- 2. Diversified income for total school budget: Total School Budget/TM appropriation
- 3. Trend for the Total School Budget and TM appropriation over time.
- 4. Outside funding options (we pursue every avenue of funding that is available, but, in general outside sources do not keep up with inflation and some are temporary)
- 5. Comparison of budget/income to other similar towns.

What outcomes do we get for the costs? Aligned with Clear. Gov

- 1. Break down of school expenditures by category
- 2. Student focused outcome: grad rates, MCAS results, college matriculation, national ratings. (Need input from administration/ need to align with state standards)
- 3. Areas to monitor for change: college grad rates, evaluation technology, innovations in learning, stress management/SEL, SPED outcomes

Where do we need to invest/improve for the future?

- 1. Needs for buildings/grounds
- 2. Future population shifts/growth
- 3. Maybe this is where we should include comparisons to other towns- re:projecting future revenue needs
