On March 12, 2020, Governor Baker issued an Executive Order modifying certain requirements of the Open Meeting Law, to enable public bodies to carry out their responsibilities while adhering to public health recommendations regarding social distancing.

The Executive Order relieves public bodies from the requirement in the Open Meeting Law that meetings be conducted in a public place that is open and physically accessible to the public, provided that the public body makes provision to ensure public access to the deliberations of the public body through adequate, alternative means. "Adequate, alternative means" may include, without limitation, providing public access through telephone, internet, or satellite enabled audio or video conferencing or any other technology that enables the public to clearly follow the proceedings of the public body in real time. A municipal public body that for reasons of economic hardship and despite best efforts is unable to provide alternative means of public access in real time may instead post on its municipal website a full and complete transcript, recording, or other comprehensive record of the proceedings as soon as practicable afterwards.

In addition, all members of a public body may participate in a meeting remotely; the Open Meeting Law's requirement that a quorum of the body and the chair be physically present at the meeting location is suspended.

All other provisions of the Open Meeting Law, such as the requirements regarding posting notice of meetings and creating and maintaining accurate meeting minutes, as well as the limited, enumerated purposes for holding an executive session, remain in effect.

While for this meeting the School Committee and members of the School Department administrative team will physically meet at the location listed above, members of the public may not attend in person. If a member of the public wishes to participate remotely in the Public Participation portion of the meeting, they should contact the Committee Chair, Ms. Sandra Fryc, by sending an email to schoolcommittee@shrewsbury.k12.ma.us.

A. Allowance for Shrewsbury Public Schools Employees to Attend School In-Person to Assist with Workforce Stability: Vote

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

At the meeting on August 19, Dr. Sawyer noted the potential for a staffing challenge at SPS as a result of educators having different schedules than their young children who attend school. He advised that one way to alleviate this pressure would be to allow SPS staff whose children go to school in Shrewsbury to attend school more frequently in-person. Dr. Sawyer advised that Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) Commissioner Jeffrey Riley had suggested and supported this type of approach for districts. Committee members engaged in discussion and expressed a desire to gather feedback from the community and information regarding the number of students that this could involve prior to voting on the recommendation at tonight's meeting.

The enclosed memorandum from Dr. Sawyer provides information and an updated recommendation.

Re: Update re: Recommendation to Allow Children of SPS Staff to Attend More

Frequently in the Hybrid Model

On August 19, I proposed that the School Committee authorize me to allow the children of SPS staff who attend district schools in kindergarten through grade 6 to be provided with the opportunity to attend school more frequently in the hybrid model, in order to assist us with a significant staffing problem related to childcare that is threatening our workforce stability.

Based on the Committee's request, we gathered more information regarding how many children of staff might be accommodated in this scenario. Based on a survey of SPS staff, there were 47 students identified.

At the same time we were gathering this data, our administrators were working on balancing out the student assignments for all of the cohorts and assessing which of our students should be assigned to Cohort A because of their high needs. The guidance from DESE on students who should be prioritized for more in-person education is pasted at the bottom of this memorandum.

At this time, the number of additional students with disabilities being identified as benefiting from more frequent school attendance constitutes at least 70 students *in addition to* those already assigned to Cohort A, and there will be even more students identified based on the criteria from DESE listed below as we continue additional evaluation of student needs. Given the number of Cohort A seats available based on current enrollment, and allowing some seats to remain open to accommodate the state's mandate that families be allowed to change their program (i.e., some may return from the all remote program), there will not be sufficient space to accommodate the children of SPS staff to assist with maintaining workforce stability, nor do I see this becoming an option, at least during the initial phase of the school year. As such, I am no longer asking the School Committee to take any action on this matter.

While I know that some disagree with the idea of providing this accommodation to facilitate our staffing based on perceptions of fairness, I stand by the intent of my original proposal as a matter of pragmatism, as many students will be affected if we have staffing instability due to childcare leaves. Like any organization, I think it behooves us to try to

find ways to support the childcare needs of our employees, which are significant due to the pandemic, and we will continue to seek other opportunities for our staff to access if possible.

From DESE

Students with complex and significant needs include:

- Students already identified as "high needs" through the IEP process on the IEP form entitled "Primary Disability/Level of Need-PL3." Such students must meet at least two of these criteria:
- Services provided outside of the general education classroom;
 - Service providers are special education teachers and related service providers;
 - Special education services constitute more than 75% of the student's school day;
- Students who cannot engage in remote learning due to their disability-related needs;
- Students who primarily use aided and augmentative communication;
- Students who are homeless
- Students in foster care or congregate care; and/or
- Students dually identified as English Learners.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:



Survey Results



If the tuition increase is approved:

Decision deadline for families Friday September 11th

- Communicate with all currently enrolled families asking for decision
- Contact everyone on the waitlist and offer 2-day spots at new rate

Extended Day Feasibility Factors

- Sufficient enrollment at higher tuition rate
- Sufficient staff to operate program

If either enrollment or staffing does not meet minimum requirements by September 11th, the program will not operate until school is able to resume full in-person learning.

Re: Recommendation for Changes to Extended School Care Tuition & Programming for

the 2020-2021 School Year

At your last meeting, Director of Extended Learning, Karen Isaacson, recommended changes to the structure and tuition for our Extended School Care program due to the move to a hybrid in-person/remote model as a result of the pandemic, which is causing a very large decrease in enrollment. Her presentation slides from last week can be found here, and updated information after she surveyed ESC families is enclosed with this memo.

While the program must be run at cost to be viable, I believe it is important to provide an offering that will enable families who need childcare before and/or after school to have an option for their children who attend our schools. As such, I recommend that

- the School Committee authorize the district to increase tuition by 60% over the original FY21 rates;
- to maintain the tuition for families who qualify for free or reduced lunch at the original FY21 rates;
- to adjust the program to offer before and after school care on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays while the hybrid learning model is in effect; and,
- if there is not sufficient enrollment to make this a self sufficient program financially, or if adequate staffing is not available, that the superintendent is authorized to suspend the operations of the Extended School Care program until such time that circumstances allow it to resume.
