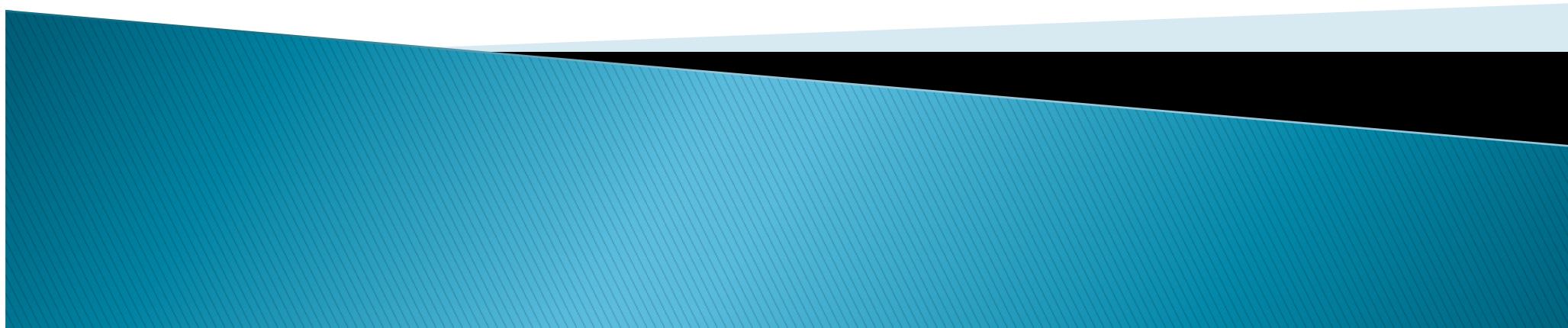

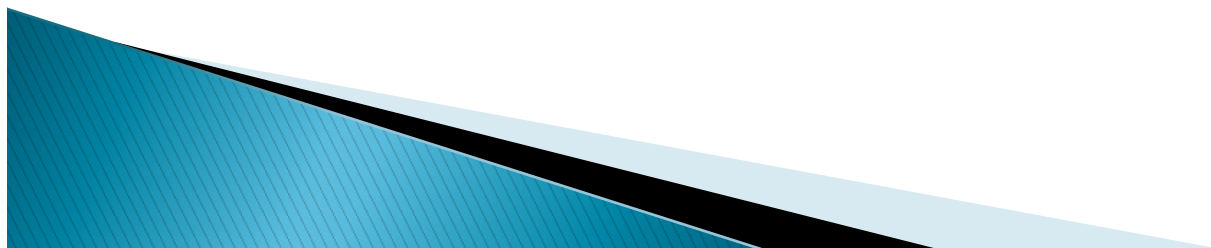
# College Board Test Administration and Score Reporting Changes

## Test Administration Changes

- ▶ 2016 Revision of SAT test included Evidence Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and Math. Separate score for Writing was eliminated.
- ▶ Summer SAT and ACT dates are added to the testing calendar.
- ▶ Saturday PSAT Test date is now optional test date.
- ▶ Changes in AP administration to come for 2018–2019 school year.

## Score Reporting Changes

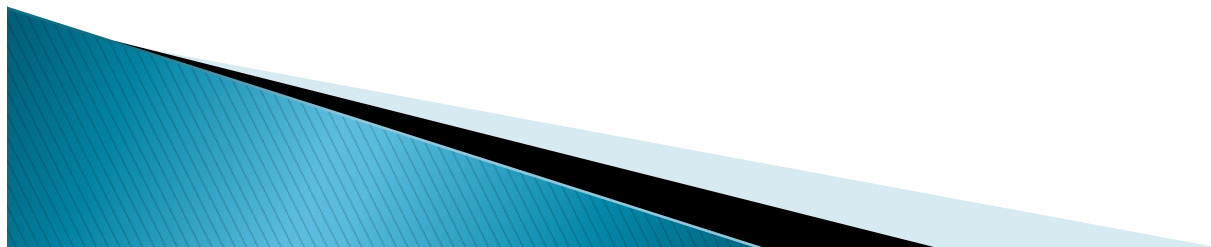
- ▶ SAT mean scores reported to DESE only include the test results of 2017–2018 school year and not by cohort of graduating class.
- ▶ SAT subject tests are no longer formally reported as part of the cohort report. National mean scores are no longer available for cohort year reports; instead mean scores are reported.



# Redesigned SAT Scales

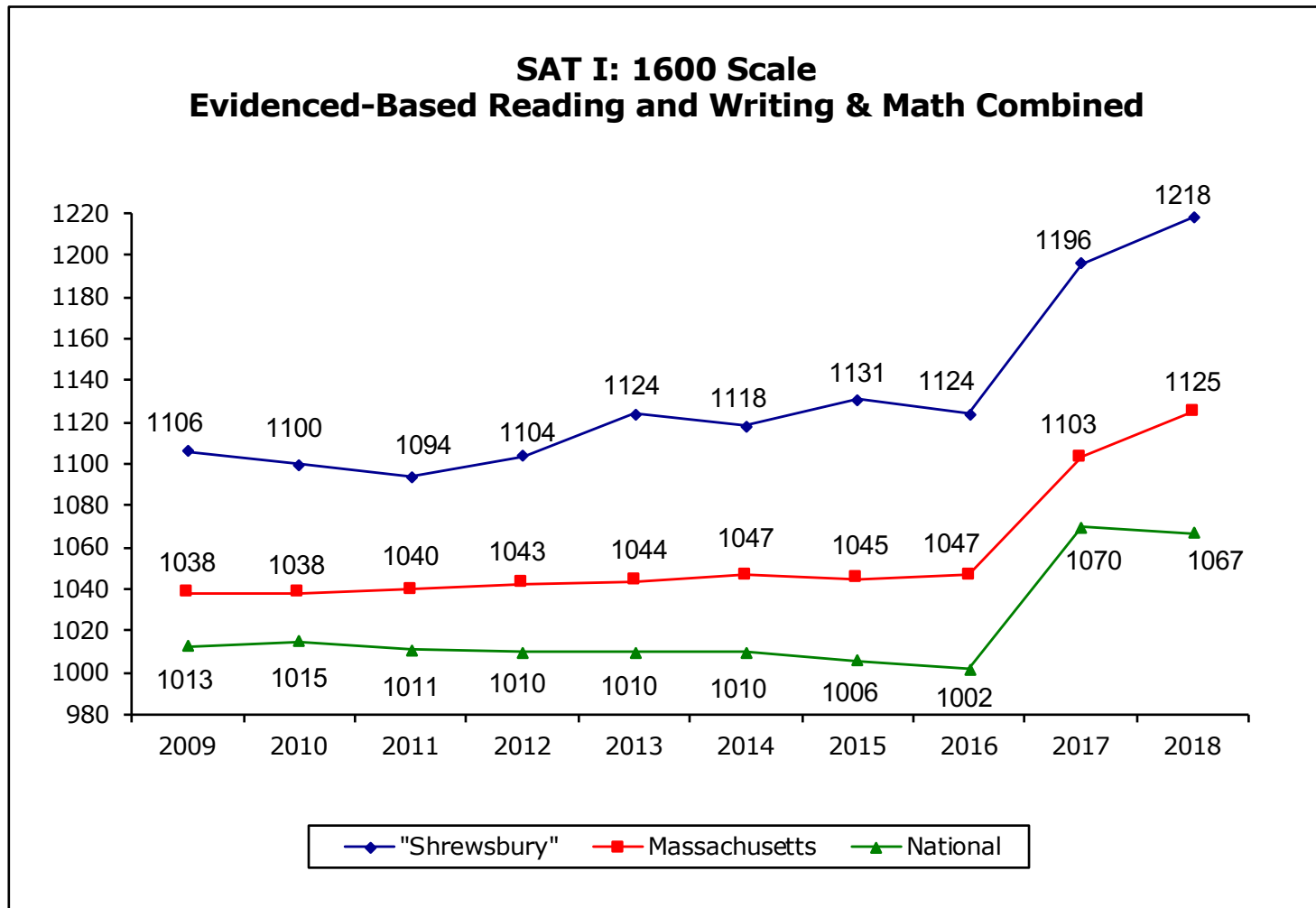
- Evidenced Based Reading & Writing (200–800)

Evidenced Based Reading & Writing + Math = 1600 scale

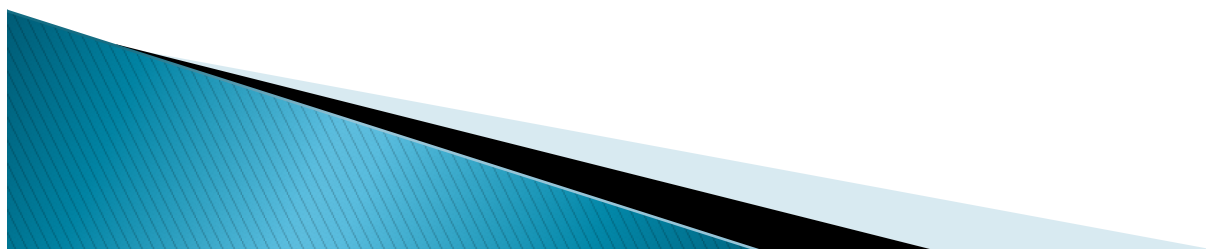
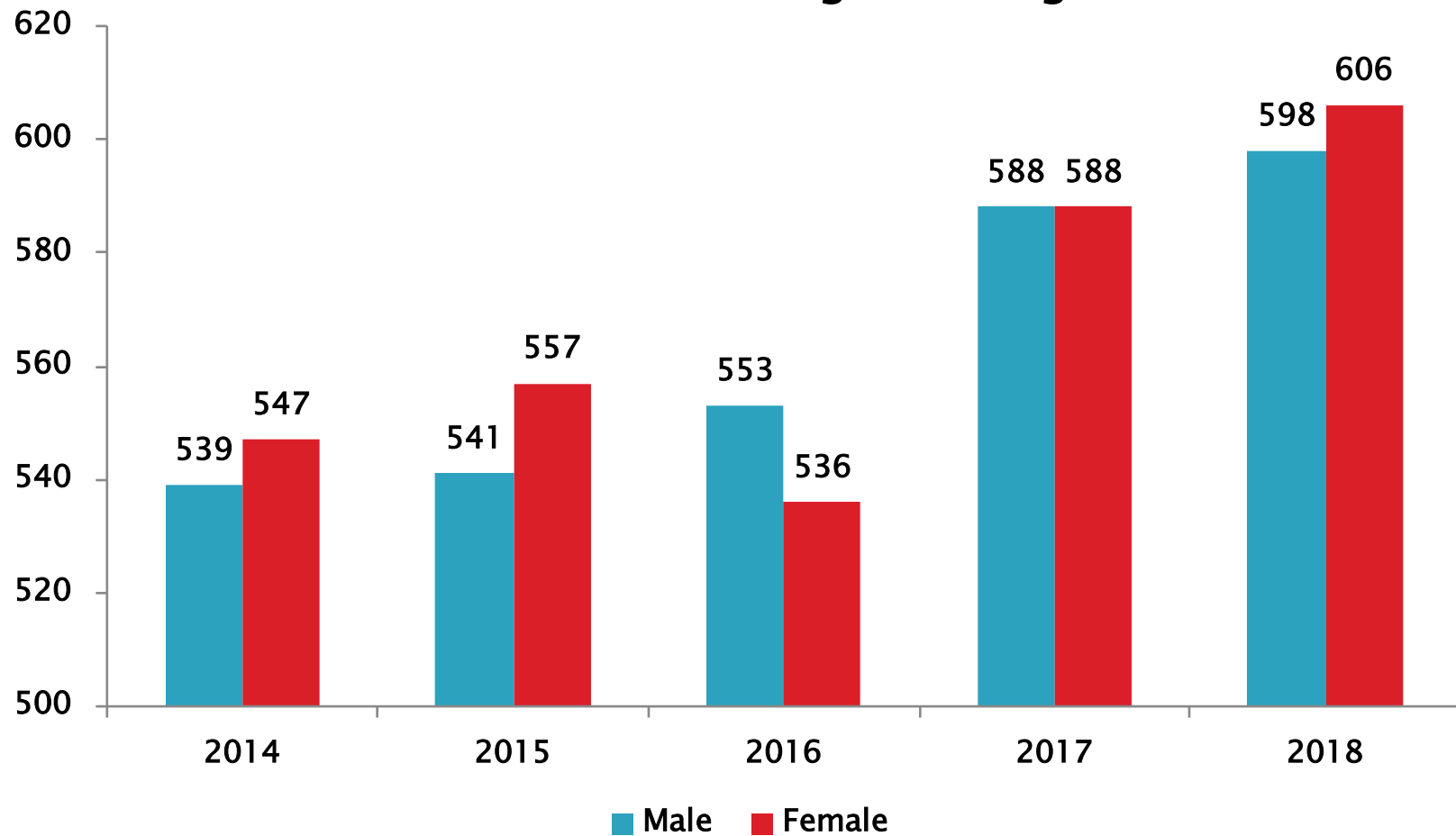




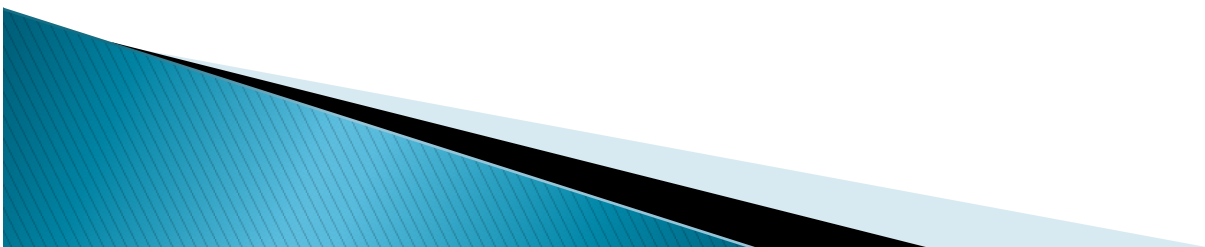
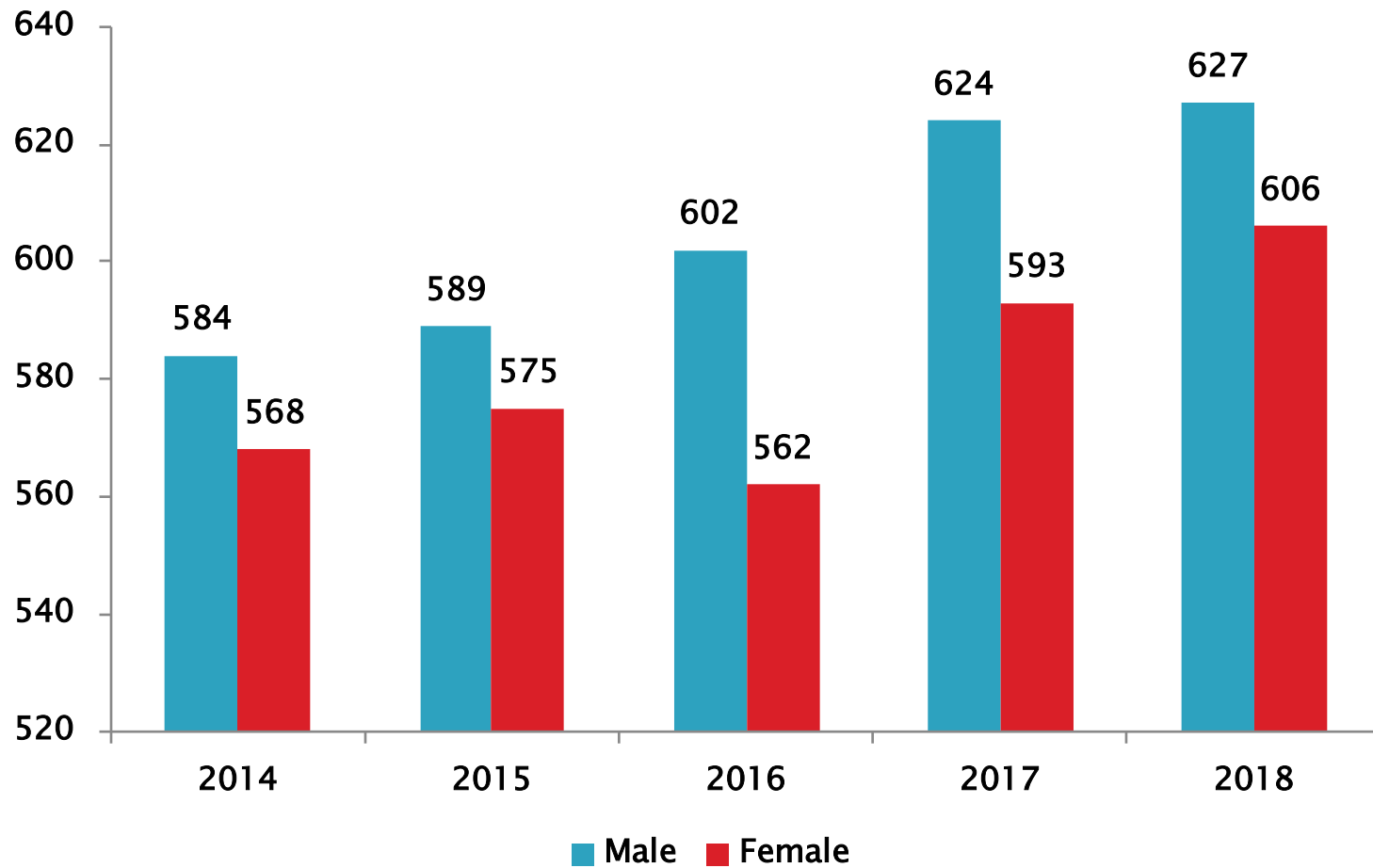
# Mean SAT Scores



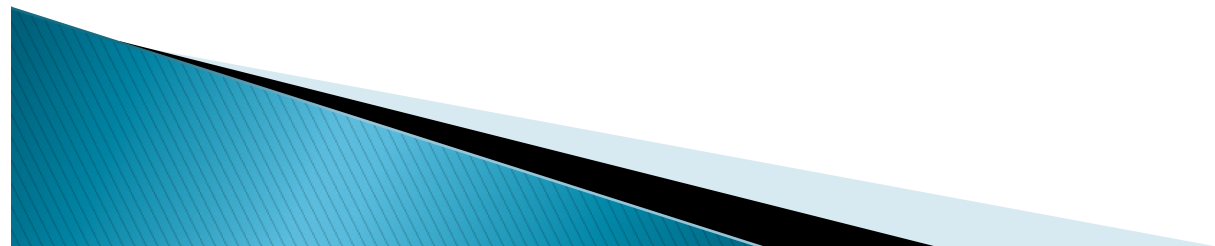
## Gender Trend: SAT Evidence Based Reading & Writing



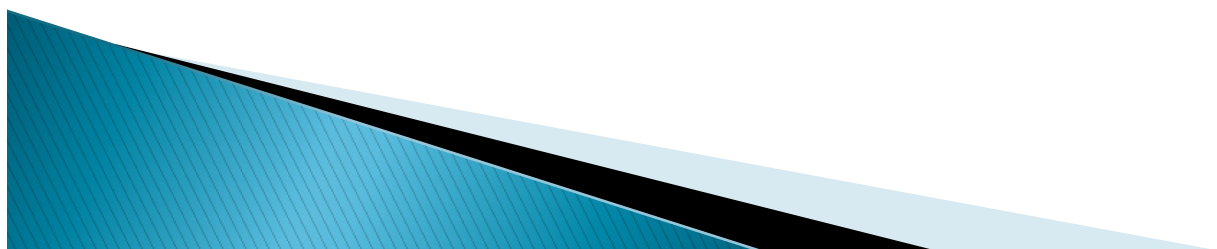
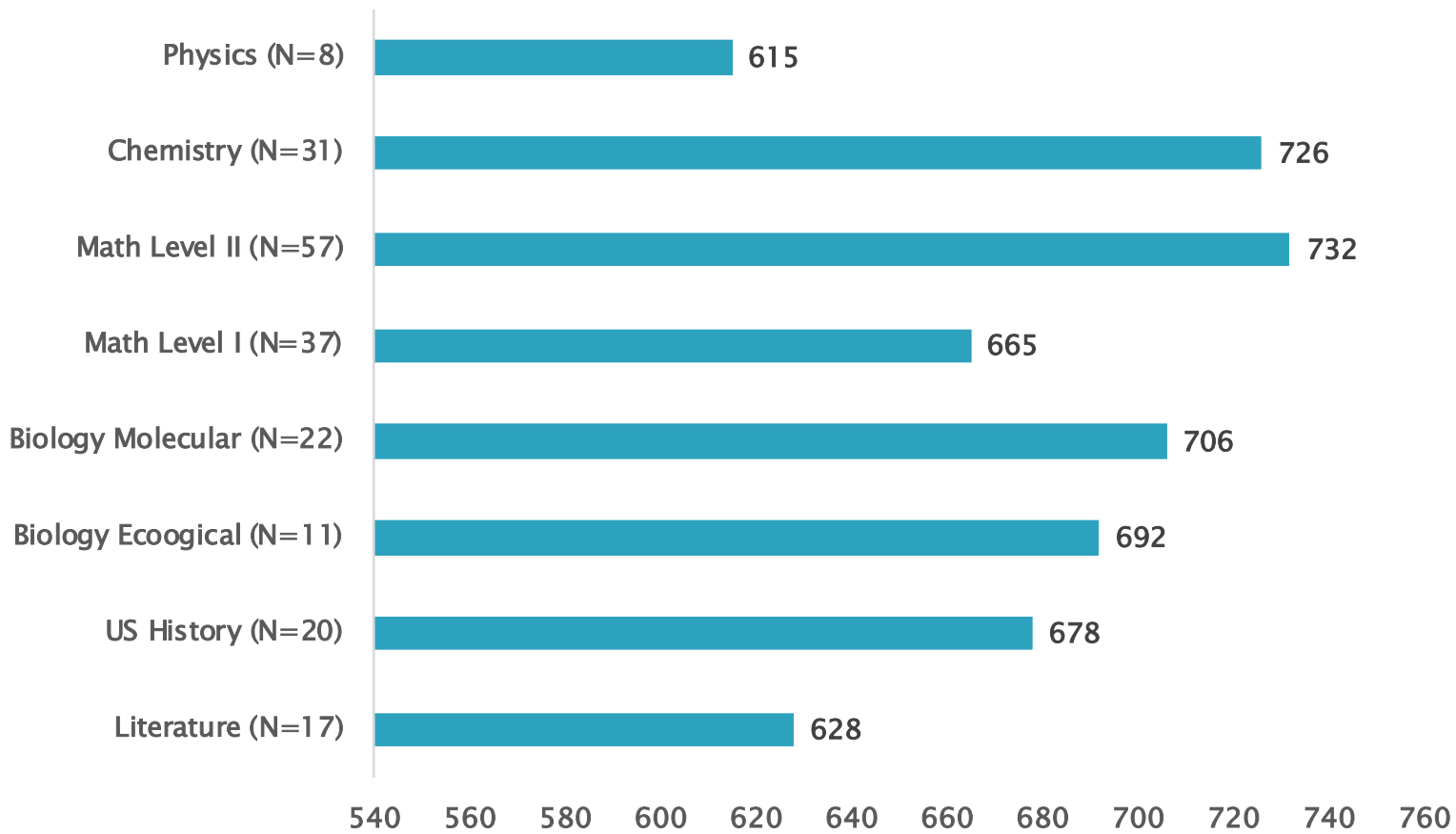
## Gender Trend: SAT Math



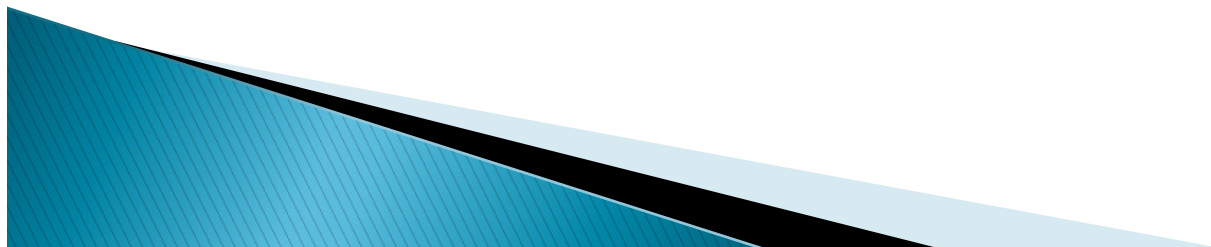

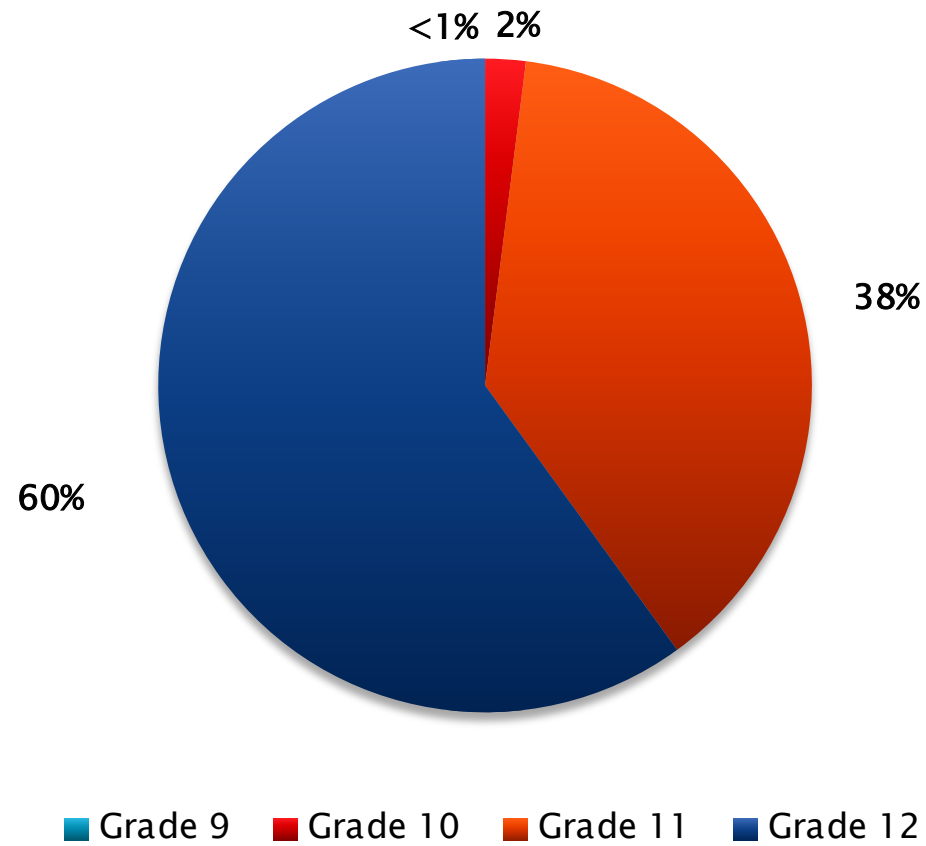

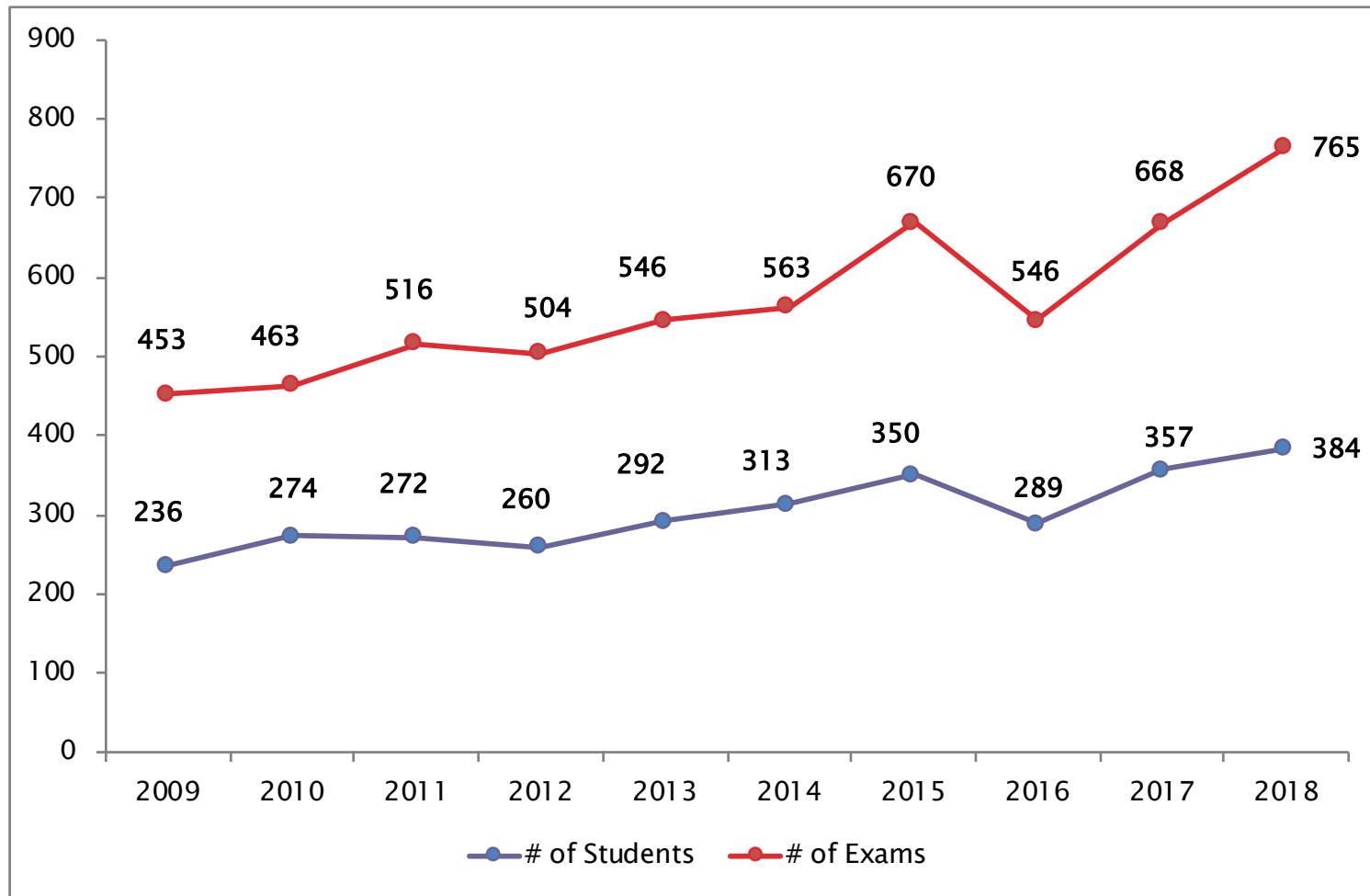
# Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

98% of students are in 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

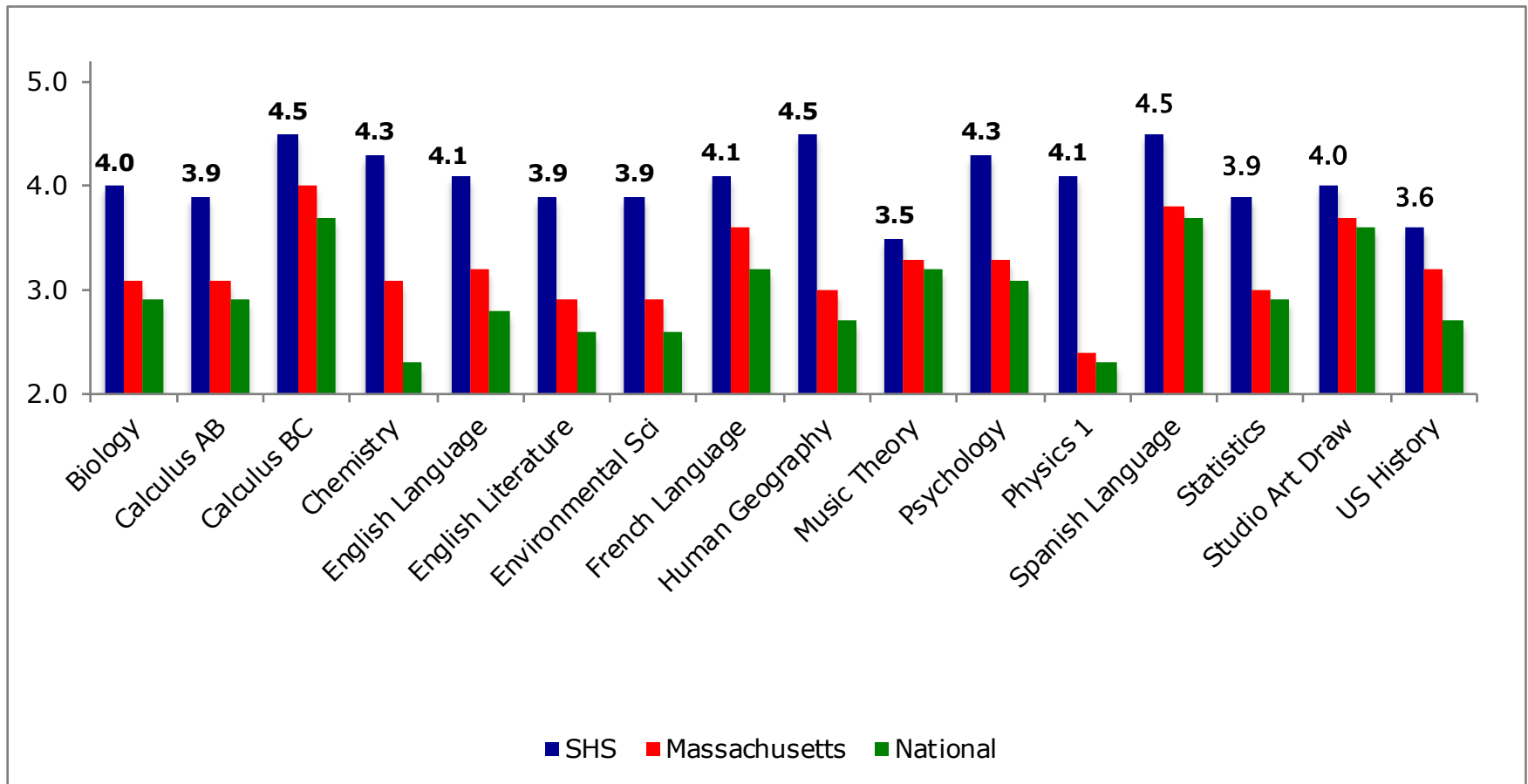


# AP Exam Participation Rates



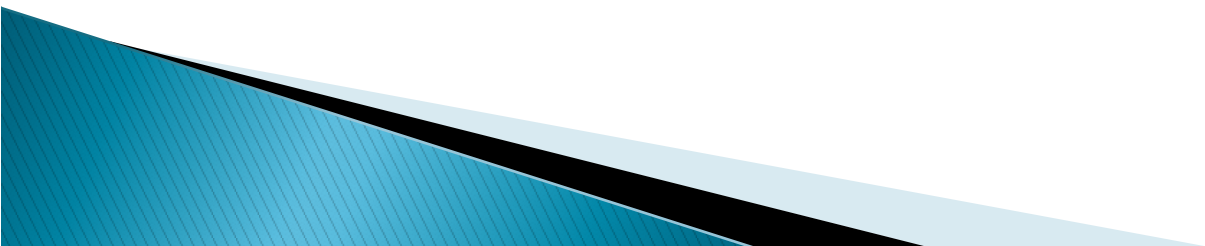
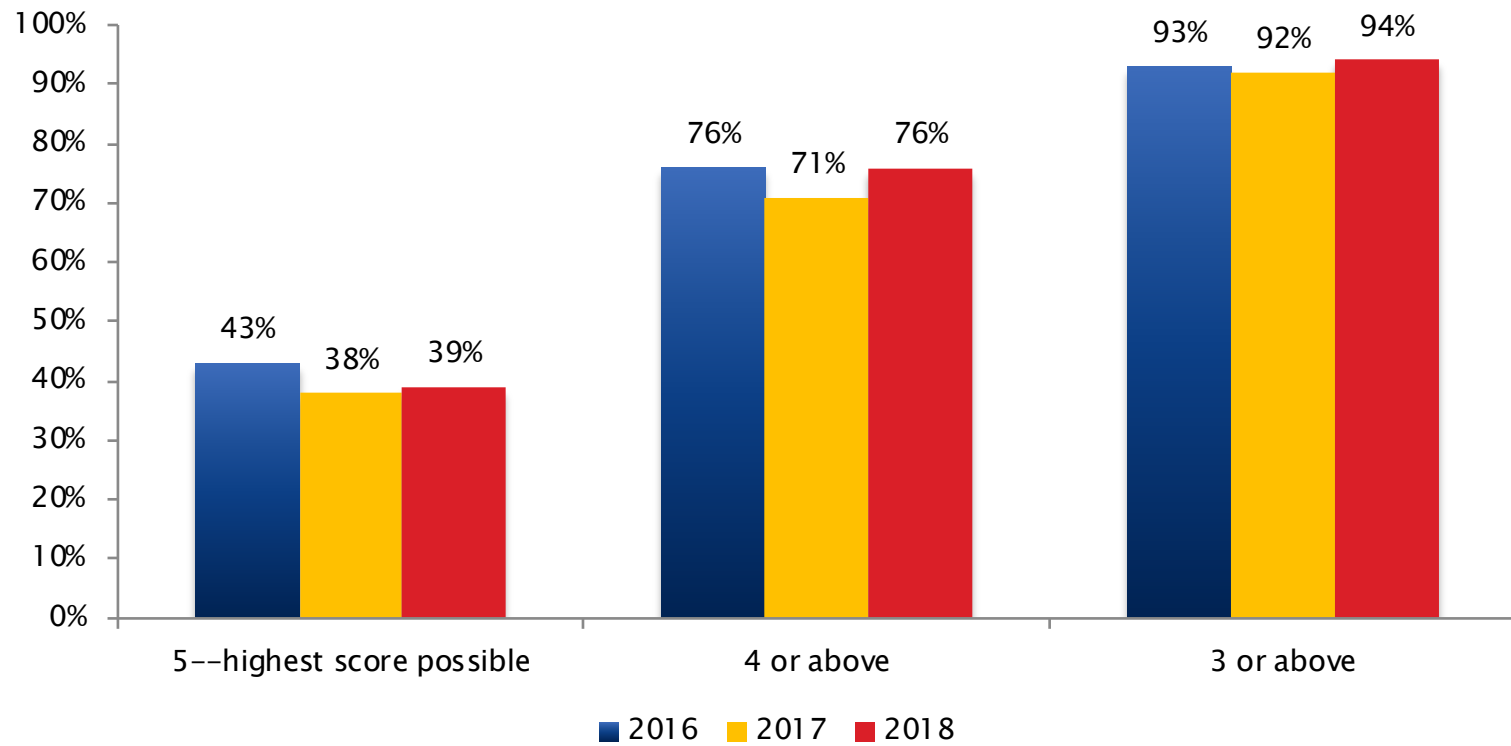

# SHS AP Exam Scores vs. National Scores:



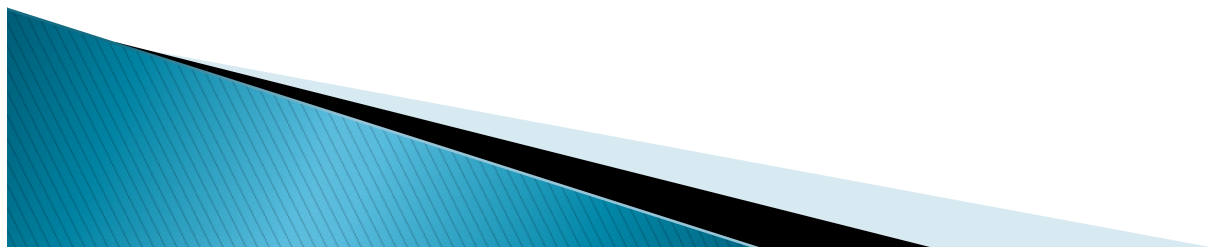


## Overall AP Exam Scores Shrewsbury High School



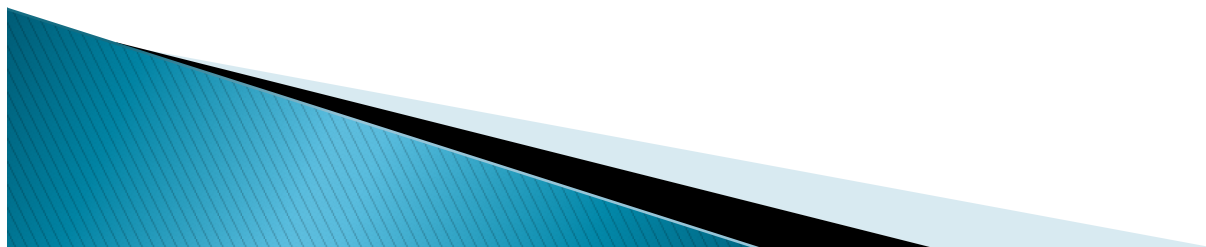

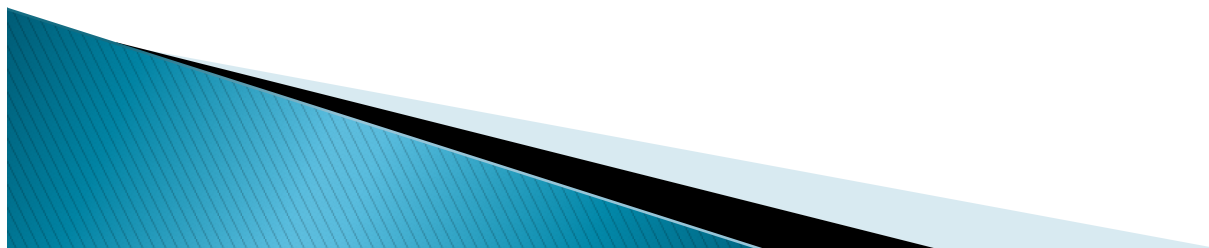

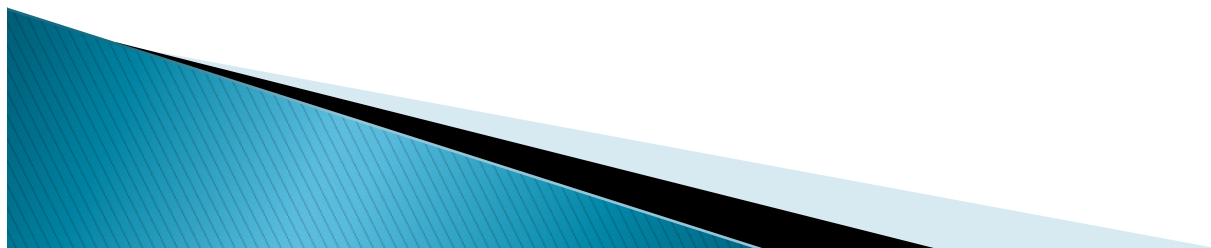
