Breaking It Down

DI consists of two parts:

- The Main Challenge - Service Learning
 - Identify a community need and carry out a community project that addresses the need
 - Create a live presentation that highlights the project and how it impacted the community
 - Create a transforming cache storage device that changes according to the development of the project
 - Use infographics and project plans
- The Instant Challenge
 - Solve a challenge in the matter a few minutes
 - Can be performance based, task based, or a combination of both
 - Use creative thinking and cooperative work to find a solution to the task



Our Main Challenge

- There are thousands of people affected by poverty everywhere.
 - We partnered with The Little Store, an organization who helps impoverished people, to execute a final project: preparing presents to children affected by poverty.
 - We created a cache storage device, which represents our vision of poverty as a tangible entity. The inside was our re-creation of the Little Store.
 - The highlight of our performance was the board-breaking scene, symbolizing the overcoming of poverty and its effects.
 - At the end, we displayed our “Prosperity’s Garden” which represents our vision of a prosperous world with the absence of poverty.
