## College Board Test Administration and Score Reporting Changes

## Test Administration Changes

- In 2021, the SAT no longer offered optional exams including the SAT Essay and SAT Subject tests.
- Covid-19 changed the landscape of standardized testing, two-thirds of the country's universities do not require the SAT or ACT in the 2021-2022 application cycle.
- The SAT program results shows that 1.7 million students in the high school class of 2022 took the SAT at least once, up from 1.5 million in the class of 2021.
- The participation rate for SHS students in the class of 2022 increased from 52\% (239 test takers) in the class of 2021 to $81 \%$ (372 test takers).

## 4 Quick AP Highlights:

1. The number of students taking AP exams is 448 (48 more than last year)
2. The number of AP exams administered is 976 (111 more than last year)
3. $53 \%$ of seniors took at least one AP exam, a particularly high percentage compared to most high schools
4. $29 \%$ of the exams administered resulted in a score of 5-the highest possible score available
