Personnel Request

- **Hire Career and Technical Education Coordinator (CTEC) at SHS**
 - **Key investment:** Shift \$75,000 that is already in the budget for start up costs for Career Technical Education to fund this role starting in FY25
 - **Responsibilities:** Support the coordination of career exploration:
 - Internships
 - Job shadowing
 - Mentorship
 - Capstone Projects
 - Postsecondary degrees and/or certificates
 - Apprenticeships
 - Employment
