## CURRENT TRENDS IN COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

## Trends

- Applications have increased by $14 \%$
- Admissions officers report essays will play a more significant role in the admission process
- Diversity policies are a top priority for universities
- Minority applications have increased by $21 \%$ increase in underrepresented minorities applying to college across the United States.

What does this mean?

- Increased applications mean increased competition
- Waitlists will continue to grow
- Colleges continue to attract international students
- More students are taking a "Gap" year
- Increase of transfers between colleges will continue
- Students and families focus on value and colleges with lower overall cost


## CLASS OF 2023

- The Class of 2023 enjoyed a successful post-secondary planning year.
- 435* students graduated in the Class of 2023 with the following plans:
- 86\% attended 4-year colleges
- 9\% attended 2-year colleges or technical schools
- 5\% entered the employment field, enlisted in the military, or were undecided

## PUBLIC \& PRIVATE 2 YEAR \& 4 YEAR MATRICULATIONS

- Of the 435 students graduating in the Class of 2023, a total of 413 ( $95 \%$ ) students continued their education at 2- and 4-year colleges and universities, or technical schools.
- Of these $\mathbf{4 1 3}$ students, 90\% attended 4-year colleges and $\mathbf{1 0 \%}$ attended 2-year colleges or technical schools.
- Of these $\mathbf{4 1 3}$ students, 57\% attended public colleges and universities; 43\% attended private colleges and universities.
