Involvement with Proposition 2 ½ Ballot Questions Purpose and Philosophy	The purpose of this policy is to inform public employees of proscribed and permitted behaviors regarding actual or potential ballot questions, thus ensuring that governmental resources are not used to underwire political activity. Staff members do not sacrifice their rights to freedom of speech relative to political questions, but are subject to specific restrictions established by the Office of Campaign and Political Finance (Interpretive Bulletins OCPF-IB-911-01 and OCPF-92-02). In general terms, taxpayer resources (paper, copy machines, telephones, fax machines, etc.) should not be used in favor or in opposition to a ballot question. However, a public employee may work for or against a ballot question on his/her own time. This policy applies to all employees of the Shrewsbury Public Schools. It does not apply to members of the elected School Committee.	
Scope	<ul> <li>Employees in the Shrewsbury Public Schools must comply with the following:</li> <li>Public employees are free to express their opinions on ballot questions on or off school property, to belong to organized groups, to contribute money to political groups, and to work for or against ballot question issues on their own time, provided that such work is not in a fund-raising capacity.</li> </ul>
