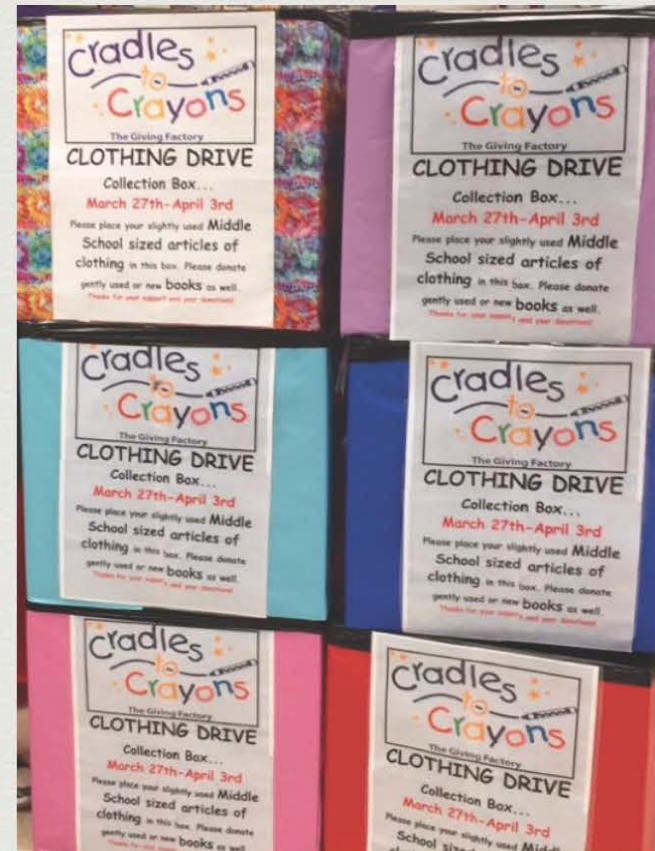


IMPORTANT MESSAGE
