


Key Goals

Shrewsbury Ranked 146th out of 14,456 high schools for doing *"the absolute best job of preparing students for college.*"





Computer-Based Testing Transition Plan

- November 2015: Board vote set a goal of implementing computer-based testing (CBT) for virtually all students by spring 2019.
- June 2016: Department <u>announces</u> phase-in plan for MCAS CBT.
- Spring 2017: All students in grades 4 and 8 will take the computer-based ELA and math tests.
- After administration, plans will be finalized to transition remaining grades to CBT.
