

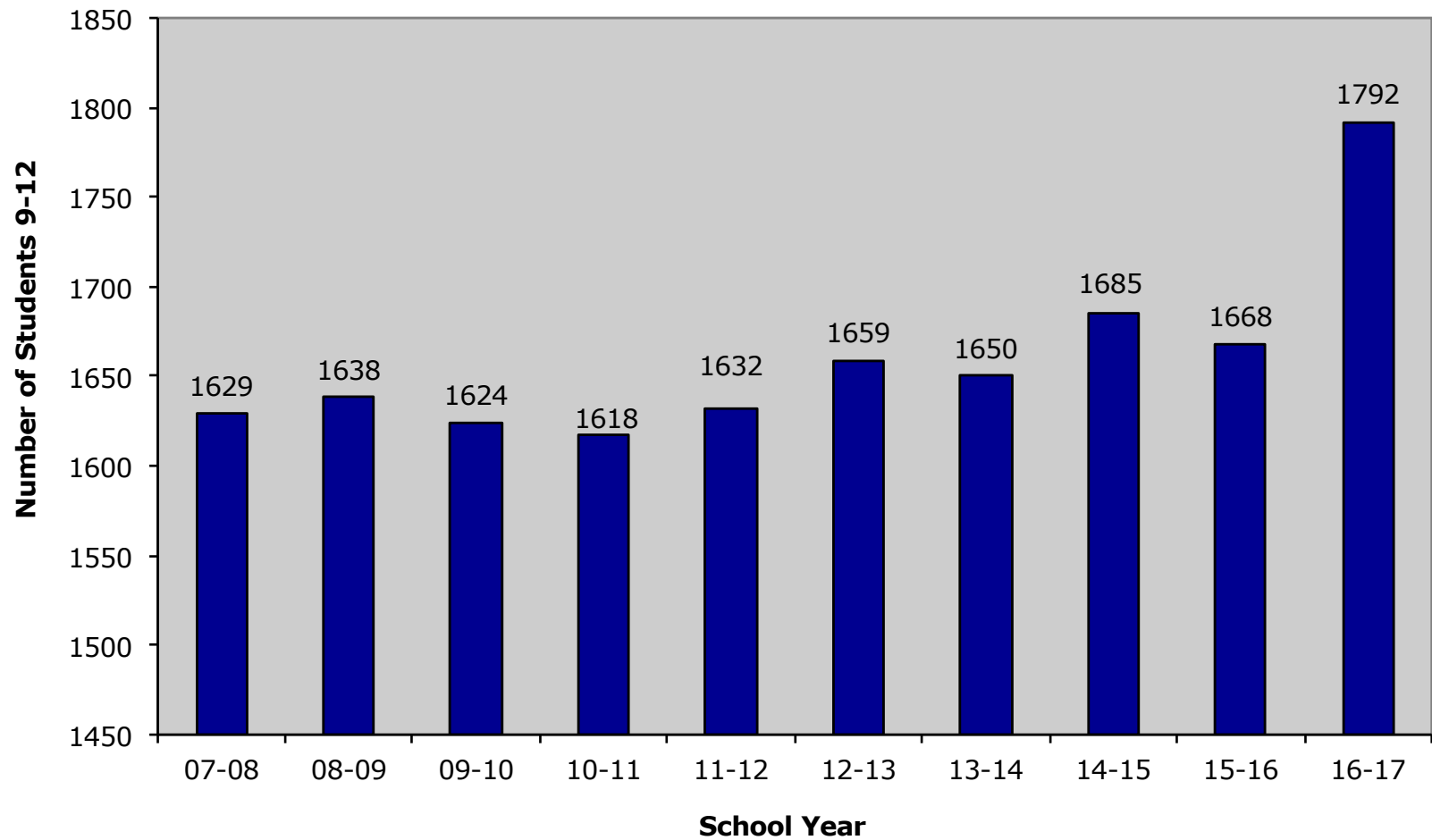

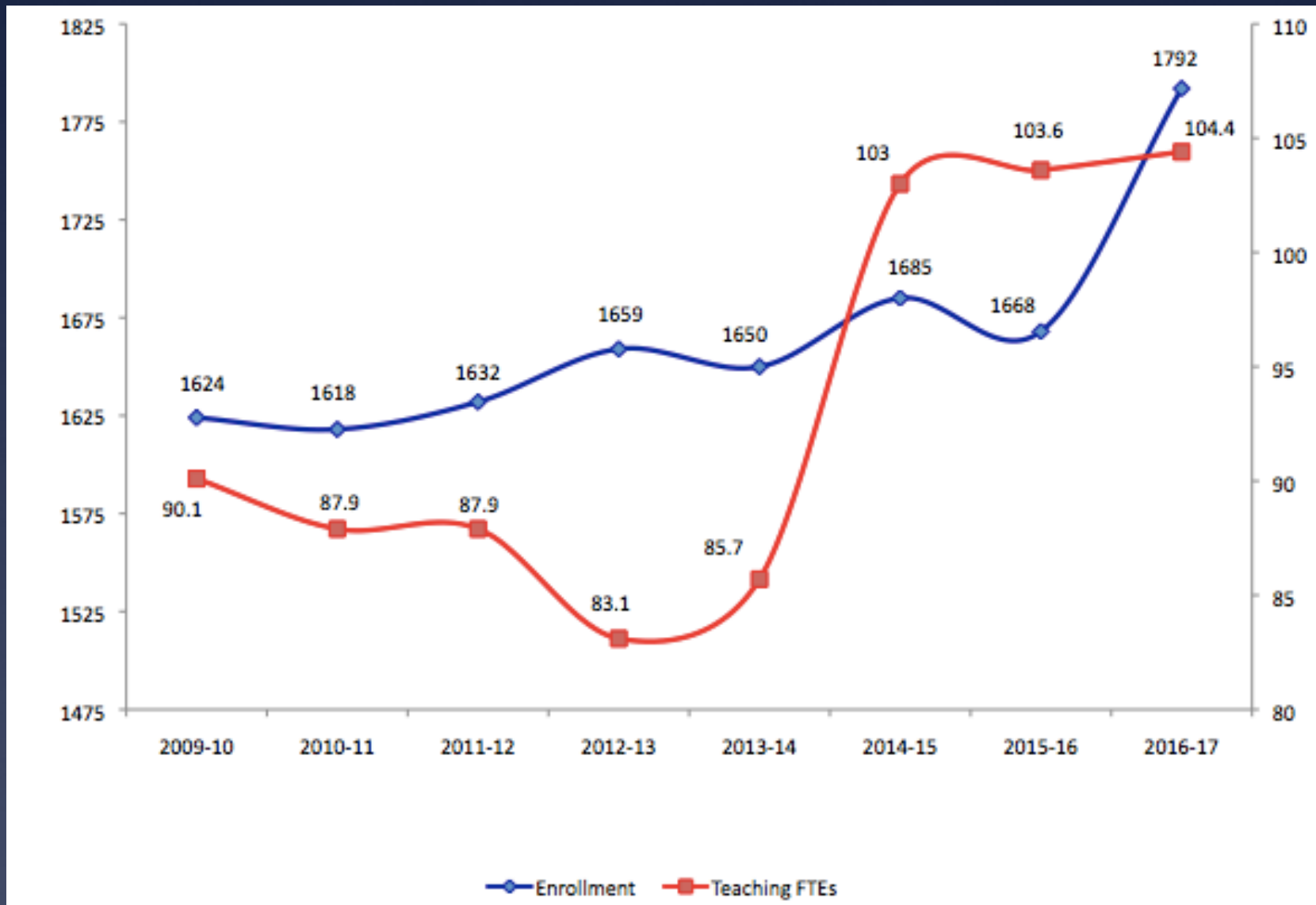

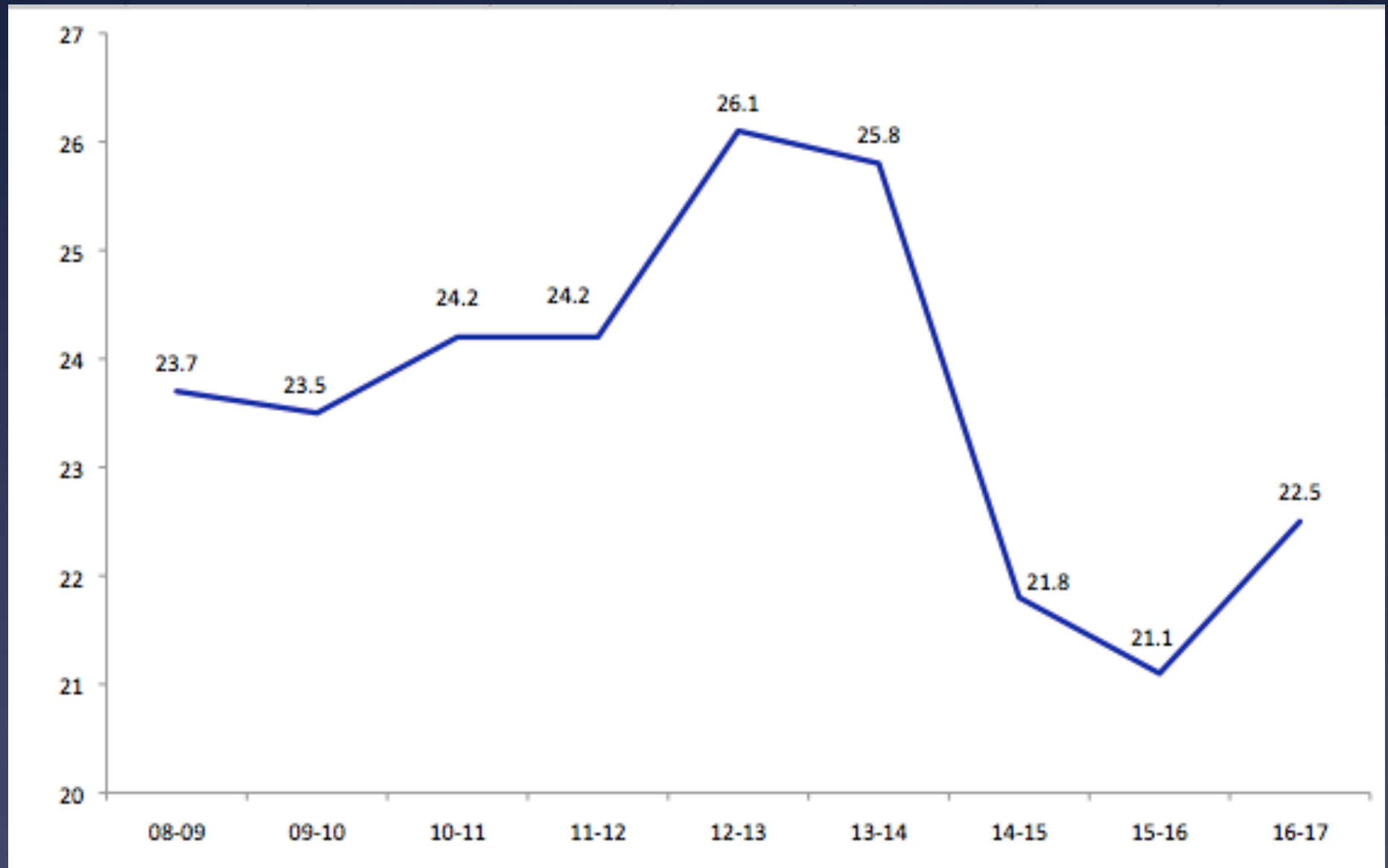

Enrollment vs. Teaching FTEs

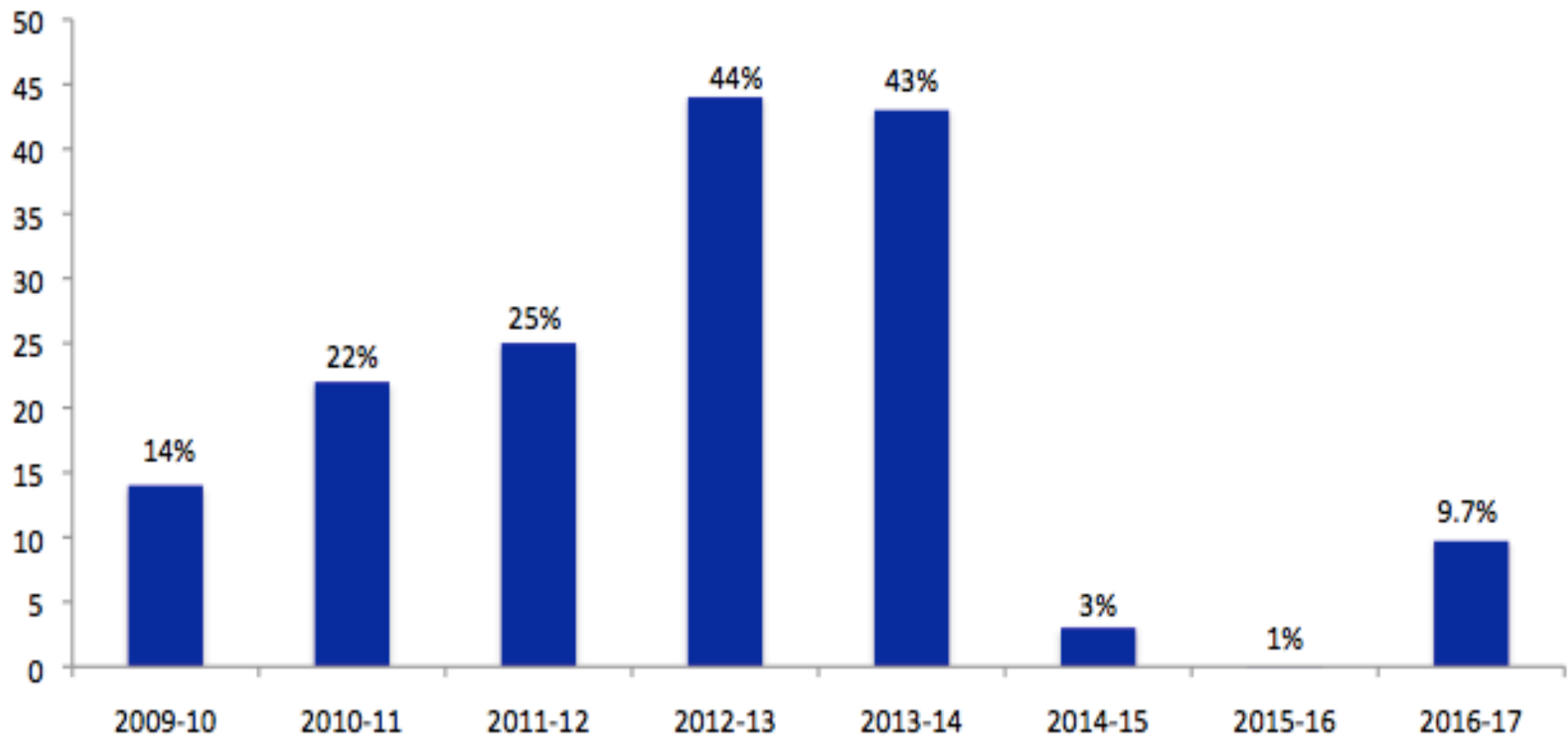


Academic Student-Teacher Ratio

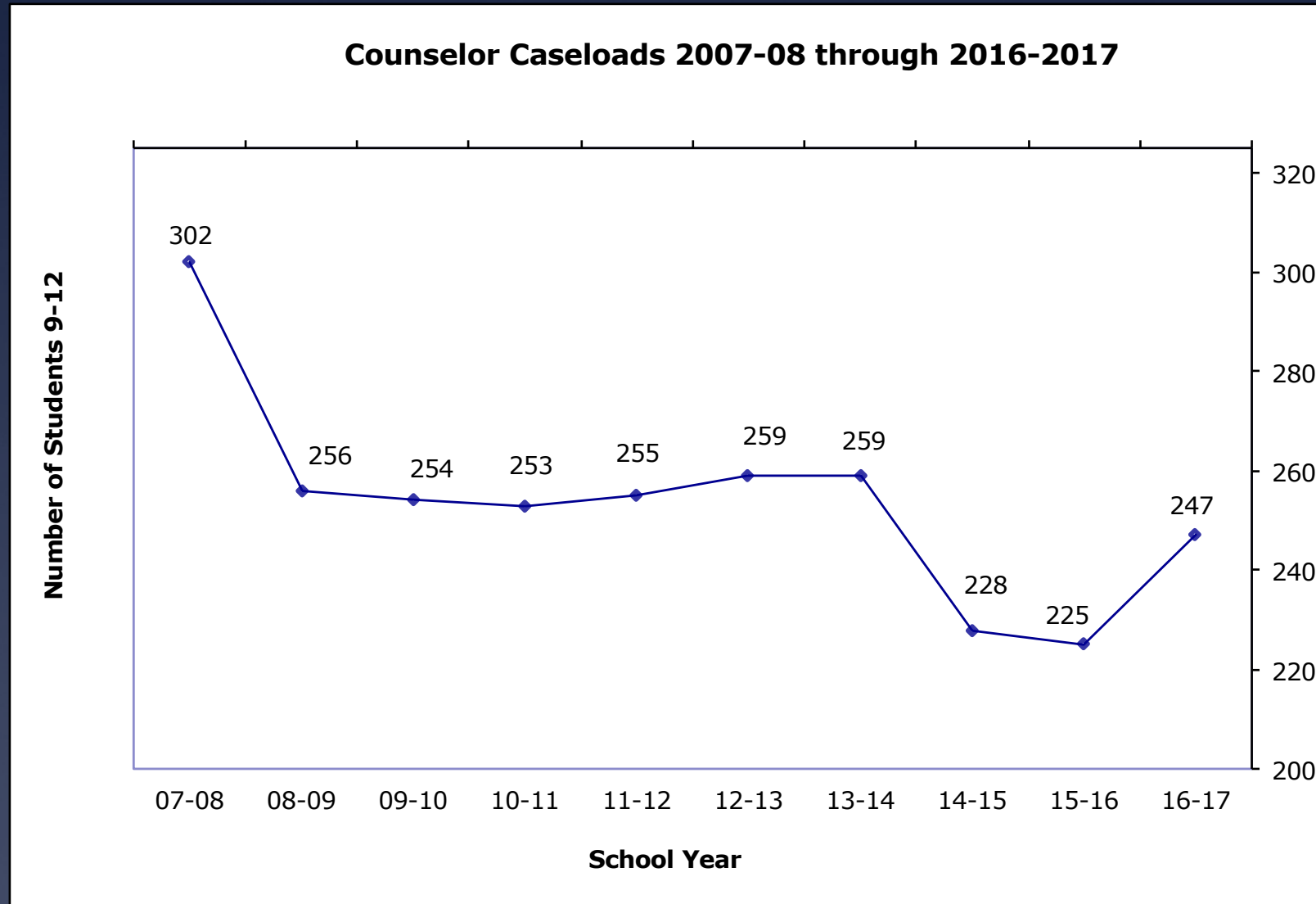

Considerations of Increased Enrollment

- Gains
 - Reduced class size and teacher caseloads
 - Increased opportunity and support for ELL and Special Education students
 - Compliance with National Safety Standards for Science
 - Minimal expansion of elective programming
 - Reduced Counselor caseloads to conform with ACA guidelines
- Maintaining gains
 - Increase FTE's to accommodate continued enrollment growth
