

# Shrewsbury Public Schools

# Fiscal Year 2015 Budget – Public Hearing February 26, 2014

#### **Key issues:**

- 1. Evidence of decline in student academic performance (State overall rating of district and 5 of 7 schools downgraded from Level 1 to Level 2)
- 2. Enrollment is forecast to increase slightly, with only a slight decline in future years (over 6,000 students in-district)
- 3. Classes of 30 or more students at all levels, which are too large and are compromising teaching and learning
- 4. Outdated instructional materials and technology are obstacles to teaching and learning
- 5. Need to build more in-district capacity to serve the needs of students with special education and mental health/behavioral needs, which will result in long-term savings for out-of-district tuition and transportation
- 6. Loss of curriculum and instructional support capacity is preventing program coordination, delaying teacher training, and compromising appropriate supervision and evaluation processes
- 7. Modest increases in staff compensation, operational costs

#### **Critical needs:**

- 1. Additional teachers to reduce class sizes
- 2. New math program in grades K-8 to align with new state curriculum (two years behind); restoration of curriculum support personnel
- 3. Additional psychological/behavioral/counseling staff to address mental and behavioral health needs
- 4. Replacement of significantly outdated computers, improvements to the network, and adequate technical support
- 5. Increased in-district special education capacity to cope with mandated needs and to continue to reduce out-of-district costs

### **Risk factors:**

- 1. Academic harm to students; reduced number and lower quality of opportunities for our children
- 2. Compromised school cultures/climates leading to problem behaviors in and out of school
- 3. Declining school district reputation and lower property values
- 4. Problems with retention and recruitment of quality personnel

## **Question for the community:**

Will our town commit to providing the level of resources required to provide our children with an education that prepares them for a successful future, and that is comparable in quality to what existed just a few years ago?
