


An assessment of current practice that includes:

- Identifying the positive practices occurring in all of our schools that promote the five core competencies of Social Emotional Learning for all students.
- Identifying areas within the five core competencies where there is inconsistency and need for improvement. (Gaps between where we are and where we want to be)
- Developing a comprehensive plan that establishes SEL standards, instructional practices, and assessment that ensure a foundational Social Emotional Learning experience for all SPS students


